Appointments to fill vacancies in subsidiary organs and other appointments: appointment of a member of the Board of Auditors

Report of the Fifth Committee

1. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 15 September 1998, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include in the agenda of its fifty-third session the item entitled "Appointments to fill vacancies in subsidiary organs and other appointments: appointment of a member of the Board of Auditors".
2. At its 20th meeting, on 6 November 1998, the Fifth Committee had before it a note by the Secretary-General (A/53/103) concerning the vacancy in the membership of the Board of Auditors that will occur as a result of the expiration of the term of office of one of its members on 30 June 1999.
3. The Committee also had before it a note by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/53/7) containing a list of three Auditors-General (or officers holding the equivalent title) nominated by their respective Governments for appointment to the Board of Auditors for a three-year term of office beginning on 1 July 1999.
4. At the same meeting, the Committee proceeded to elect by secret ballot an Auditor-General (or officer holding the equivalent title) from the candidates proposed. The result of the voting was as follows:

Recommendation of the Fifth Committee

5. The Fifth Committee recommends that the General Assembly appoint the Chairman of the Commission of Audit of the Philippines as a member of the Board of Auditors for a three-year term of office beginning on 1 July 1999.
