## I. Introduction

1. The previous recommendations made by the Fifth Committee to the General Assembly under item 113 appear in the report of the Committee contained in document A/53/485.

2. The Fifth Committee resumed its consideration of the item at its 3rd to 6th, 15th, 25th, 26th, 28th, 33rd and 37th to resumed 45th meetings, on 2, 6, 7, 12 and 29 October, 12, 13, 16, 23 and 30 November and 1, 4, 7, 8, 10, 14, 15 and 18 December 1998. Statements and observations made in the course of the Committee's consideration of the item are reflected in the relevant summary records (A/C.5/53/SR.3–6, 15, 25, 26, 28, 33 and 37–45).

3. In accordance with the criteria for use of the contingency fund annexed to General Assembly resolution 42/211 of 21 December 1987, the Committee, at its resumed 45th meeting, on 18 December, considered a consolidated statement of all programme budget implications and revised estimates that were subject to the criteria for the use of the contingency fund. The consolidated amount fell within the available balance of the contingency fund. The Committee therefore proceeded to approve the required amounts under the relevant sections of the programme budget.

4. Section II of the present report provides a summary of the recommendations of the Fifth Committee during the fifty-third session of the General Assembly on the revised estimates submitted by the Secretary-General and on the programme budget implications of resolutions adopted by the Assembly, either on the recommendation of its Main Committees or in respect of items considered in plenary meeting.

5. Section III of the present report provides a summary of the special subjects considered by the Fifth Committee that led to the adoption of specific decisions to be recommended to the General Assembly.

6. The recommendations of the Fifth Committee are contained in section IV of the present report.

### II. Programme budget for the biennium 1998–1999

7. In its resolution 52/221 A and B of 22 December 1997, the General Assembly approved budget appropriations for the biennium 1998–1999 in the amount of \$2,532,331,200 and income estimates in the amount of \$363,840,300.

8. Recommendations of the Fifth Committee during the current session of the General Assembly on revised estimates submitted by the Secretary-General, as well as on the programme budget implications of resolutions adopted by the Assembly under items considered by other Main Committees or in respect of items considered in plenary, have resulted in a net decrease in the approved level of appropriations in the amount of \$5,627,700 and a net reduction in the approved income estimates in the amount of \$1,150,700.

9. The revised estimates of expenditure and income approved by the Fifth Committee and the financial implications of resolutions recommended by other Main Committees and subsequently by the General Assembly are indicated, by expenditure and income section, below:

10. At its resumed 45th meeting, on 18 December, the Committee considered the revised estimates of expenditure and income to be recommended for approval by the General Assembly for the biennium 1998–1999, as well as the financing of the appropriations for the year 1999. The Committee took the following action:

(a) The Committee approved the revised budget appropriations for the biennium 1998–1999 (see para. 43, draft resolution II A);

(b) The Committee approved the revised income estimates for the biennium 1998–1999 (see para. 43, draft resolution II B);

(c) The Committee approved the draft resolution on the financing of the appropriations for the year 1999 (see para. 43, draft resolution II C).

## III. Consideration of special subjects

#### 1. Request for a subvention to the United Nations Institute for Disarmament Research resulting from the recommendations of the Board of Trustees of the Institute on the work programme of the Institute for 1999

11. The Committee considered this question at its 28th meeting, on 16 November. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/53/29). The report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions was presented orally by its Chairman.

12. At the same meeting, on the proposal of the Chairman, the Committee decided, without a vote, to approve the recommendation for a subvention of \$213,000 from the regular budget of the United Nations for 1999, on the understanding that no additional appropriation would be required under section 2B, Disarmament, of the programme budget for the biennium 1998–1999 (see para. 43, draft resolution I A, sect. I).

#### 2. Office accommodation at the Palais Wilson

13. The Committee considered this question at its 25th and 26th meetings, on 12 and 13 November. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General on a cost-benefit analysis on the use of existing conference facilities at the Palais Wilson in Geneva (A/53/302).

14. At its 26th meeting, on 13 November, on the proposal of the Chairman, the Committee decided, without a vote, to recommend to the General Assembly that it take note of the report of the Secretary-General on a cost-benefit analysis on the use of existing conference facilities at the Palais Wilson in Geneva (see para. 43, draft resolution I A, sect. II).

#### 3. Net budgeting, including its impact on the functioning of the entities concerned

15. The Committee considered this question at its 39th meeting, on 4 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/53/410). The report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions was presented orally by its Chairman.

16. At the same meeting, on the proposal of the Chairman, the Committee decided to recommend to the General Assembly that it take note of the report of the Secretary-General on net budgeting, including its impact on the functioning of the entities concerned and endorse the observations of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (see para. 43, draft resolution I A, sect. III).

#### 4. First performance report

17. The Committee considered this question at its 39th to 41st and resumed 45th meetings, on 4, 7, 8 and 18 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/53/693) and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/53/7/Add.8).

18. At its resumed 45th meeting, on 18 December, the Committee had before it a draft resolution entitled "First performance report" (A/C.5/53/L.36). At the same meeting, the Committee adopted draft resolution A/C.5/53/L.36 without a vote (see para. 43, draft resolution I A, sect. IV).

#### 5. Consolidation of technical secretariat servicing of intergovernmental bodies

19. The Committee considered this question at its 42nd meeting, on 10 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/53/452).

20. At the same meeting, on the proposal of the Chairman, the Committee decided, without a vote, to recommend to the General Assembly that it take note of the report of the Secretary-General and revert to this question as appropriate in the context of the reform process (see para. 43, draft resolution I A, sect. V).

#### 6. Construction of additional conference facilities at Addis Ababa and Bangkok

21. The Committee considered this question at its 25th meeting, on 12 November. It had before it the reports of the Secretary-General (A/52/579 and A/53/347) and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/53/7/Add.5).

22. At the same meeting, on the proposal of the Chairman, the Committee decided, without a vote, to recommend to the General Assembly that it take note of the reports of the Secretary-General on the construction of conference facilities at Addis Ababa and Bangkok and endorse the recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions contained in paragraph 5 of its report (see para. 43, draft resolution I A, sect. VI).

#### 7. Integrated Management Information System

23. The Committee considered this question at its 37th, 41st, 42nd and resumed 45th meetings, on 30 November and 8, 10 and 18 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/53/573), the note by the Secretary-General transmitting the study of the Integrated Management Information System conducted by independent experts (A/53/662) and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/53/7/Add.7).

24. At its resumed 45th meeting, on 18 December, the Committee had before it a draft resolution entitled "Integrated Management Information System" (A/C.5/53/L.32), submitted on the basis of informal consultations.

25. At the same meeting, the Committee adopted draft resolution A/C.5/53/L.32 without a vote (see para. 43, draft resolution I A, sect. VII).

8. Conditions of service and compensation for officials other than Secretariat officials: members of the International Court of Justice, judges of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991, and judges of the International Criminal Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Genocide and Other Serious Violations of

#### International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of Rwanda and Rwandan Citizens Responsible for Genocide and Other Such Violations Committed in the Territory of Neighbouring States between 1 January and 31 December 1994

26. The Committee considered this question at its 28th and 43rd meetings, on 16 November and 14 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General on conditions of service and compensation for officials other than Secretariat officials: members of the International Court of Justice (A/C.5/53/11) and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/53/7/Add.6).

27. At the 43rd meeting, on 14 December, the representative of the Bahamas, Vice-Chairman of the Committee, introduced a draft resolution entitled "Conditions of service and compensation for officials other than Secretariat officials: members of the International Court of Justice, judges of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991, and judges of the International Criminal Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Genocide and Other Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of Responsible for Genocide and Other Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of Responsible for Genocide and Other Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of Responsible for Genocide and Other Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of Responsible for Genocide and Other Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of Responsible for Genocide and Other Such Violations Committed in the Territory of Neighbouring States between 1 January and 31 December 1994" (A/C.5/53/L.25).

28. At the same meeting, the Committee adopted draft resolution A/C.5/53/L.25 without a vote (see para. 43, draft resolution I A, sect. VIII).

#### 9. United Nations Political Office in Bougainville

29. The Committee considered this question at its 44th meeting, on 15 December. It had before it the report of the United Nations Political Office in Bougainville: revised estimates under section 3, Peacekeeping operations and special missions; section 32, Staff assessment; and income section 1, Income from staff assessment (A/C.5/53/47). The report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions was presented orally by its Chairman.

30. At the same meeting, on the proposal of the Chairman, the Committee decided, without a vote, to recommend to the General Assembly that it take note of the estimate of \$1,395,300 under section 3, Peacekeeping operations and special missions, and \$148,300 under section 32. Staff assessment, of the programme budget for the biennium 1998–1999, on the understanding that such additional appropriations as may be necessary will be dealt with outside the procedures related to the contingency fund, as provided in annex I, paragraph 11, of General Assembly resolution 41/213 of 19 December 1986 (see para. 43, draft resolution I A, sect. IX).

#### 10. Contingency fund

31. The Committee considered this question at its resumed 45th meeting, on 18 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/53/48). The report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions was presented orally by its Chairman.

32. At the same meeting, the Fifth Committee decided, without a vote, to recommend to the General Assembly that it appropriate the required amounts, as contained in the report of the Secretary-General, and that it note that a balance of \$15,307,800 would remain in the contingency fund (see para. 43, draft resolution I A, sect. X).

## **11.** Recosting of outstanding statements of programme budget implications and revised estimates

33. The Committee considered this question at its resumed 45th meeting, on 18 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/53/L.49). The report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions was presented orally by its Chairman at the resumed 45th meeting.

34. At the same meeting, on the proposal of the Chairman, the Committee decided, without a vote, to recommend to the General Assembly that it take note of the report of the Secretary-General and that the recosting and the related adjustments be reflected in the revised appropriation for the biennium 1998–1999 (see para. 43, draft resolution I A, sect. XI).

# 12. Financial arrangements associated with the dining room at the International Court of Justice

35. The Committee considered this question at its 25th and 42nd meetings, on 12 November and 10 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/53/19).

36. At the 42nd meeting, on 10 December, the Chairman of the Committee introduced a draft decision entitled "Financial arrangements associated with the dining room at the International Court of Justice" (A/C.5/53/L.17), submitted on the basis of informal consultations.

37. At the same meeting, the Committee adopted draft decision A/C.5/53/L.17 without a vote (see para. 44, draft decision I).

# 13. Relationship between the treatment of perennial activities in the programme budget and the use of the contingency fund

38. The Committee considered this question at its 42nd and resumed 45th meetings, on 10 and 18 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/52/42) and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/53/7/Add.9).

39. At its resumed 45th meeting, on 18 December, on the proposal of the Chairman, the Committee decided to recommend to the General Assembly that it defer consideration of the report of the Secretary-General and the related report of the Advisory Committee (see para. 44, draft decision II).

#### 14. Development Account

40. The Committee considered this question at its 3rd, 4th, 15th, 28th, 40th and resumed 45th meetings, on 5, 6 and 29 October, 16 November and 7 and 18 December. It had before it the reports of the Secretary-General (A/52/1009 and A/53/374) and the related reports of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/53/7/Add.1 and 4).

41. At the resumed 45th meeting, on 18 December, the representative of Bangladesh, coordinator of informal consultations on this question, introduced, on behalf of the Chairman, a draft decision entitled "Development Account" (A/C.5/53/L.34), submitted on the basis of informal consultations.

42. At the same meeting, the Committee adopted draft decision A/C.5/53/L.34 without a vote (see para. 44, draft decision III).

*Takes note* of the report of the Secretary-General on net budgeting, including its impact on the functioning of the entities concerned,<sup>2</sup> and endorses the observations of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions;

#### IV

#### **First performance report**

#### The General Assembly,

Having considered the first performance report of the Secretary-General on the programme budget for the biennium 1998–1999<sup>3</sup> and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions,<sup>4</sup> 1. *Reaffirms* the budgetary process as approved in its resolution 41/213 of 19

1. *Reaffirms* the budgetary process as approved in its resolution 41/213 of 19 December 1986 and as reaffirmed in subsequent resolutions;

2. *Reaffirms also* its resolution 52/220 of 22 December 1997;

3. *Takes note* of the first performance report of the Secretary-General on the programme budget for the biennium 1998–1999<sup>1</sup> and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions;<sup>2</sup>

4. *Reaffirms* the requirement of all Member States to fulfil their financial obligations as set out in the Charter of the United Nations promptly and in full and without imposing conditions;

5. *Recognizes* the detrimental effect of the withholding of assessed contributions on the administrative and financial functioning of the United Nations;

6. *Approves* a net decrease of 48,200,900 dollars in the appropriations approved for the biennium 1998–1999, and a net decrease of 4,552,500 dollars in the estimates of income for the biennium 1998–1999, to be apportioned among expenditure and income sections as indicated in the report of the Secretary-General;

7. *Expresses concern* about the fact that a number of sections of the programme budget continue to reflect high levels of vacancy, which could have an impact on the full implementation of the programmes and activities mandated by the General Assembly;

8. *Reiterates* that the vacancy rate is a tool for budgetary calculations and should not be used to achieve budgetary savings;

9. *Reiterates* that a high vacancy rate hampers the delivery of mandated programmes and activities and stresses that deliberate management decisions to keep a certain number of posts vacant makes the budget process less transparent and the management of staff resources more difficult;

10. *Reaffirms* that only the General Assembly has the authority to establish and abolish posts in the regular budget;

11. *Requests* the Secretary-General to immediately intensify recruitment efforts, in order to reduce the number of vacancies, particularly in those areas where there are high vacancy rates;

12. *Decides* that the vacancy rate for posts in the Professional and higher categories should not be more than 5 per cent at the end of the biennium 1998–1999 and, in this context, requests the Secretary-General to take all the necessary steps to achieve this objective;

13. *Requests* the Secretary-General to enhance the Office of the President of the General Assembly by taking all the necessary steps to ensure the full implementation of paragraph 1B.10 of the report of the Secretary-General entitled "United Nations reform: measures and proposals",<sup>5</sup> as adopted by the General Assembly in its resolution 52/220, so as to provide transparency and accountability and thereby strengthen the ability of the President of the General Assembly to effectively and efficiently discharge the responsibilities of the Office as deemed appropriate;

14. *Decides* that the President of the General Assembly, consistent with the approved programme budget, should have full authority to use the funds provided in the budget for the Office, including hospitality and travel and any other requirements for the accomplishment of the official responsibilities;

15. *Takes note* that paragraphs 74 to 80 of its resolution 52/220 defined the procedures to be followed in the proposed programme budget in dealing with activities related to country special rapporteurs whose mandates had expired in 1997 and, as a consequence, there were no individual mandates for their inclusion in the proposed programme budget for the biennium 1998–1999;

16. *Reaffirms* that, in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 79 of its resolution 52/220, no funds directly related to these non-mandated activities could be committed to them

pending the consideration of the report on the relationship between the treatment of perennial activities and the use of the contingency fund, as requested in paragraph 78 of its resolution 52/220;

17. *Regrets* that the provisions of the decision contained in paragraph 79 of resolution 52/220 were not implemented, since the required report was not considered before 1998 activities related to country special rapporteurs were implemented;

18. *Requests* the Secretary-General to improve the presentation of the budget performance reports by separately reflecting the impact of average vacancy rates in changes related to salaries and common staff costs for each budget section;

19. *Also requests* the Secretary-General to provide an explanation when average vacancy rates are higher than the level approved by the General Assembly;

20. *Reiterates* the need for the Secretary-General to ensure that resources are utilized strictly for the purposes approved by the General Assembly;

21. *Regrets* the tendency towards excessive use of consultants, in particular in areas where in-house expertise is available, and requests the Secretary-General to resort in future to the use of consultants only when in-house expertise is not available and in accordance with the existing rules and regulations and relevant resolutions;

22. *Reaffirms* that changes in mandated programmes and activities are the prerogative of the General Assembly;

#### V

#### Consolidation of technical secretariat servicing of intergovernmental bodies

*Takes note* of the report of the Secretary-General<sup>6</sup> and decides to revert to this question as appropriate in the context of the reform process;

#### VI

#### Construction of additional conference facilities at Addis Ababa and Bangkok

*Takes note* of the reports of the Secretary-General on the construction of conference facilities at Addis Ababa and Bangkok<sup>7</sup> and endorses the recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions contained in paragraph 5 of its report;<sup>8</sup>

#### **Integrated Management Information System**

The General Assembly,

Reaffirming its resolutions 43/217 of 21 December 1988 and 52/227 of 31 March 1998,

1. *Expresses serious concern* that the tenth progress report of the Secretary-General has not been submitted in full compliance with paragraph 13 of its resolution 52/227;

2. *Notes with concern* that the report of the Office of Internal Oversight Services requested in paragraph 11 of its resolution 52/227, which should have been taken into account in preparing the tenth progress report, has not been submitted;

3. *Requests* the Board of Auditors to review the status of implementation of the recommendations contained in its updated special audit of the Integrated Management Information System,<sup>12</sup> taking into account the provisions of General Assembly resolution 52/227;

4. *Also requests* the Board of Auditors to continue monitoring the activities related to the Integrated Management Information System project as part of its ongoing regular audits of the financial statements;

5. *Reiterates* the request contained in paragraph 16 of its resolution 52/227 that the Secretary-General ensure that adequate and qualified staff are assigned to the implementation and operation of the Integrated Management Information System at all duty stations;

6. *Requests* the Secretary-General to take all the necessary action to ensure that the project-related activities are performed with a maximum of efficiency and economy;

7. *Decides* to approve an additional appropriation of 3.3 million United States dollars;

8. Decides also to defer further consideration of the tenth progress report of the Secretary-General, the report of the independent experts on the Integrated Management Information System project and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions to the resumed fifty-third session, and requests the Secretary-General to submit, through the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, an addendum to his report, taking into consideration the report of the Office of Internal Oversight Services.

Budget appropriations totalling 1,260,537,900 dollars and consisting of 1,266,165,600 dollars, being half of the appropriations initially approved for the biennium 1998–1999 in resolution 52/221 A of 22 December 1997, less 5,627,700 dollars, being the reduction approved by the Assembly in resolution A above, shall be financed in accordance with regulations 5.1 and 5.2 of the Financial Regulations as follows:

(a) 42,955,681 dollars, consisting of:

(i) 19,176,800 dollars, being half of the estimated income other than income from staff assessment approved for the biennium 1998–1999 by the Assembly in its resolution 52/221 B of 22 December 1997;

(ii) Less 460,600 dollars, being the reduction approved by the Assembly in resolution B above;

(iii) 24,239,481 dollars, being the balance in the surplus account as at 31 December 1997;

(b) 1,217,582,219 dollars, being the assessment on Member States in accordance with its resolution 52/215 A of 22 December 1997 on the scale of assessments for the years 1998 and 1999;

2. There shall be set off against the assessment on Member States, in accordance with the provisions of General Assembly resolution 973 (X) A of 15 December 1955, their respective share in the Tax Equalization Fund in the total amount of 178,491,720 dollars, consisting of:

(a) 162,743,350 dollars, being half of the estimated staff assessment income approved by the Assembly in its resolution 52/221 B;

(b) Less 690,100 dollars, being the estimated decrease in income from staff assessment approved by the Assembly in resolution B above;

(c) Plus 16,438,470 dollars, being the increase in income from staff assessment for the biennium 1996–1997 compared with the revised estimates approved by the General Assembly in its resolution 52/213 B of 22 December 1997.

### **Draft decision I**

## Financial arrangements associated with the dining room at the International Court of Justice

The General Assembly takes note of the report of the Secretary-General on financial arrangements associated with the dining room at the International Court of Justice,<sup>19</sup> with the understanding, provided by the Secretariat, that the United Nations provides no subsidy in any form for the operation of the dining room at the International Court of Justice.

### **Draft decision II**

# Relationship between the treatment of perennial activities in the programme budget and the use of the contingency fund

The General Assembly decides to defer consideration of the report of the Secretary-General on the relationship between the treatment of perennial activities in the programme budget and the use of the contingency fund<sup>20</sup> and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions.<sup>21</sup>

### **Draft decision III**

#### **Development Account**

The General Assembly decides to defer consideration of the proposals contained in the reports of the Secretary-General on the Development Account<sup>22</sup> and related actions recommended by the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions<sup>23</sup> to the first part of its resumed fifty-third session.
