1. At its 67th meeting, on 8 November 1981, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/36/78) on the administrative and financial implications of draft resolution I recommended by the Sixth Committee in paragraph 10 of its report (A/36/781). The recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions were presented orally by its Chairman.
2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's consideration of this item are reflected in the relevant summary record (A/C.5/36/SR.67).

DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

3. The Fifth Committee decided, without objection, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution I recommended by the Sixth Committee in paragraph 10 of its report (A/36/781), no additional appropriation would be required at this stage. Such appropriations, as may be required, would be considered during the thirty-seventh session of the General Assembly. The related conference-servicing costs, estimated on a full-cost basis at \$3,291,600, would be considered in the context of the consolidated statement of conference-servicing requirements for 1983 to be submitted at the thirty-seventh session of the General Assembly.
