## <u>Addendum</u>

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3970th meeting, held on 28 January 1999 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on

the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon for the period from 16 July 1998 to 15 January 1999 (S/1999/61).

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1999/75) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1999/75, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1223 (1999) (for the text, see S/RES/1223 (1999); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-fourth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1999).

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, see S/PRST/1999/4; to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-fourth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1999).

The situation concerning Western Sahara (see S/11593/Add.42 and 44; S/19420/Add.38; S/21100/Add.25; S/22110/Add.17; S/23370; S/25070/Add.9; S/1994/20/Add.12, 29 and 45; S/1995/40/Add.1, 14, 20, 25, 37 and 50; S/1996/15/Add.21 and 47; S/1997/40/Add.11, 20, 39 and 42; and S/1998/44/Add.4, 15, 29, 37, 43 and 50)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3971st meeting, held on 28 January 1999 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1999/78) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1999/78, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1224 (1999) (for the text, see S/RES/1224 (1999); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-fourth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1999).

The situation in Georgia (see S/23370/Add.40; S/25070/Add.4, 26, 27, 31, 34, 37, 42, 44, 45 and 51; S/1994/20/Add.4, 8, 9, 11, 13, 25, 28 and 47; S/1995/40/Add.1, 10, 18 and 32; S/1996/15/Add.1, 16, 27 and 42; S/1997/40/Add.4, 18, 30 and 44; and S/1998/44/Add.4, 21, 30 and 47)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3972nd meeting, held on 28 January 1999 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General concerning the situation in Abkhazia, Georgia (S/1999/60).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Georgia and Germany, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1999/79) submitted by France, Germany, the Russian Federation, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1999/79, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1225 (1999) (for the text, see S/RES/1225 (1999); to be issued in <u>Official Records of the Security Council</u>, <u>Fifty-fourth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council</u>, 1999).

The situation between Eritrea and Ethiopia (see S/1998/44/Add.25)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3973rd meeting, held on 29 January 1999 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Ethiopia, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1999/90) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1999/90, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1226 (1999) (for the text, see S/RES/1226 (1999); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-fourth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1999).
