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PROPOSED PROGRAMME BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM 1982-1983

TRADE AND DEVELOPMENT

Revised estimates resulting from resolutions and decisions adopted by the Trade and Development Board at its twenty-second and twenty-third sessions held in Geneva

Report of the Secretary-General

1. At its twenty-second and twenty-third sessions, held in Geneva from 9 to 20 March 1981 and from 28 September to 12 October 1981, respectively, the Trade and Development Board adopted resolutions and took decisions, the implementation of which would involve additional costs in the biennium 1982-1983. These resolutions and decisions, together with the statements of administrative and financial implications presented to the Board, are contained in the annexes to the report of the Trade and Development Board on its twenty-second and twenty-third sessions. 1/

A. Resolution 226 (XXII). Protectionism and structural adjustment

2. Resolution 226 (XXII) provides for the establishment of a new sessional committee of the Board at its twenty-fourth session and annually thereafter at its first regular session, to carry out the annual reivew of the patterns of production and trade in the world economy and to continue to review developments involving restrictions of trade, as provided for in parts A and B, respectively, of Conference resolution 131 (V). On the assumption that the new sessional committee

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would require one additional conference room, would be serviced in six languages and would require 60 pages of in- and post-session documentation, the annual conference-servicing costs are estimated to be \$138,200 at 1982 rates and \$144,900 at 1983 rates. Details of these costs are shown in annex I.

B. Resolution 231 (XXII). Rationalization of the permanent machinery of UNCTAD

3. In paragraph 28 of resolution 231 (XXII), the Board decided to increase the number of informal consultations provided for in Board decision 143 (XVI), preferably to one a month. This would increase the total number of consultations held by about seven a year. Assuming that these additional consultations would be held for one half-day each, would require one conference room and would be serviced in six languages, the additional annual costs are estimated to be \$22,200 at 1982 rates and \$23,300 at 1983 rates. Details of the estimated costs are shown in annex II.

C. Decision 244 (XXIII). Review of the calendar of meetings

4. During its twenty-third session, the Board adopted the above decision in which it approved the calendar of meetings for the remainder of 1981 and for 1982, and the tentative schedule for 1983. The approved calendar of meetings for 1982 provides for the convening of an Intergovernmental Preparatory Group on Conditions of Registration of Ships recommended by the Committee on Shipping in its resolution 43 (S-III). On the assumption that the Intergovernmental Group would hold a total of three weeks of meetings in Geneva in 1982, would require three conference rooms, would be serviced in six languages and would require a total of 200 pages of documentation, the estimated conference-servicing costs are estimated to be \$379,100.

D. Other action taken by the Board

5. At its twenty-third session, the Board, having taken note of a statement of administrative and financial implications submitted by the secretariat, agreed to recommend to the General Assembly new levels of servicing for the Working Party on the Medium-term Plan and the Programme Budget and for the Working Group on International Shipping Legislation. The statement of administrative and financial implications submitted to the Board provided for increasing the level of conference services for the Working Party on the Medium-term Plan and the Programme Budget by a caucus team of interpreters. On the assumption that the Working Party would meet twice a year for one week each time, the annual additional costs are estimated at \$59,300 based on 1982 rates and \$62,300 based on 1983 rates. It is also assumed that the Working Group on International Shipping Legislation would meet for two weeks a year. Based on this assumption, the annual additional costs are estimated at \$88,500 using 1982 rates and \$92,900 using 1983 rates. The details of the cost estimates for the Working Party and the Working Group are provided in annexes IV and V, respectively.

E. Summary

6. The conference-servicing costs in this submission are presented on a full-cost basis, that is, as if none of the requirements can be provided out of the resources requested under the proposed programme budget for the biennium 1982-1983. The total amount involved for the biennium 1982-1983, calculated at an exchange rate of 1.71 Swiss francs per United States dollar, is estimated at \$1,010.700. No additional appropriation is requested in this report since the requirements for 1982 will be considered in the context of a consolidated statement to be submitted towards the end of the thirty-sixth session of the General Assembly, in which the Secretary-General will report on the level of additional conference resources to be requested in the light of the pattern of conferences for 1982 as approved by the General Assembly. Requirements for 1983 will be considered in the context of a consolidated statement to be submitted at the thirty-seventh session of the General Assembly.
