#### SECTION 26. LEGAL ACTIVITIES

#### A. Policy-making organs

#### I. Programme developments

#### International Law Commission

26.1 The Commission carried out its programme of work as planned and at its thirty-third session adopted the final text of its draft articles on succession of States in respect of matters other than treaties.

#### United Nations Commission on International Trade Law

26.2 The Commission essentially carried out its planned programme of work, as described in paragraph 26.9 of the Secretary-General's initial programme budget proposals for the biennium 1980-1981. The Commission's Working Group on International Negotiable Instruments completed the draft Convention on International Bills of Exchange and International Promissory Notes and the Convention on a Set of Uniform Rules dealing with Cheques. However, the sessions of the working groups were not held as frequently as expected. The Second UNCITRAL Symposium was held in Vienna from 19 to 26 June 1981, and 62 participants from 42 countries attended, 19 participants of which were provided with fellowships.

#### United Nations Administrative Tribunal and its secretariat

26.3 It is expected that the Tribunal will have rendered 28 judgements by the end of the current biennium.

#### II. Revised budget estimates

#### Travel (Decrease: \$136,100)

26.4 Savings arises in respect of (a) the International Law Commission due to less than full participation by representatives and the reduced cost of attendance at meetings (\$104,300), (b) the United Nations Commission on International Trade Law due to the fact that the Chairman did not travel as extensively as foreseen and sessions of the working groups were held less frequently than expected (\$18,800) and (e) the United Nations Administrative Tribunal due to less than full attendance by members (\$13,000).

#### External printing (Increase: \$148,100)

26.5 Additional requirements in respect of the International Law Commission, are due to a charge to the 1980-1981 budget of the cost of publications carried over from the 1978-1979 publications programme (\$131,900) and in respect of UNCITRAL to cover the cost of the English and Russian versions of the official records of the United Nations Conference on the Carriage of Goods by Sea, 1978 (\$16,200).

#### Honoraria (Decrease: \$5,300)

26.6 Less than full participation by representatives accounts for the unencumbered balance of \$5,300 in respect of the International Law Commission.

#### B. Special meetings and conferences

United Nations Conference on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods

- 26.7 The Conference adopted the United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods and opened it for signature at its concluding meeting on 11 April 1980.
- 26.8 In accordance with paragraphs 5 (e), (f) and (i) of General Assembly resolution 33/93, resources in the amount of \$21,100 were provided to finance the travel and subsistence of observers to the Conference; since no observers attended the Conference the full amount is surrendered. Savings of \$8,800 under external printing were realized in the joint printing and reproduction of the official records of the Conference.

#### C. Office of Legal Affairs

### Programme developments

#### General Legal Division

26.9 The responsibility for the production of the Repertory of Practice of the United Nations Organs was assigned to the Office of the Legal Counsel. In compliance with paragraph 10 of General Asembly resolution 35/164 five basic volumes of the Repertory of Practice of United Nations Organs were reprinted in English and one volume of the table of contents and subject index thereto.

#### II. Revised budget estimates

#### Redeployment of posts

26.10 In order to place the functions relating to the production of the Repertory of Practice inder the direct purview of the Legal Counsel, the D-l post relating to Repertory matters was redeployed from the General Legal Divsion to the Office of the Legal Counsel.

#### Salaries and common staff costs (Decrease: \$195,900)

26.11 The decrease under salaries and comon staff costs is attributable in the main to a vacancy of 17 months at the P-3 level and 12 months at the P-4 level in the International Trade Law Branch and includes an amount of \$31,200 in respect of temporary posts due to recruitment difficulties experienced in 1980. Of this total, an amount of \$86,500 was utilized by the Office of the Legal Counsel in order to collaborate with UNITAR in the study on legal aspects of the new international economic order (see para. 26.14 below). Another partly offsetting factor was the need for additional general temporary assistance for the Codification Division and Treaty Section.

#### External printing (Decrease: \$165,800)

26.12 Savings results from the publication of 54 volumes of the <u>Treaty Series</u> instead of 85 volumes as originally planned in the amount of \$181,800 (of which \$62,400 relate to the resources provided for the elimination of the backlog), partly offset by additional requirements in respect of the publication of the <u>United Nations Juridical Yearbook</u> (\$16,000).

#### General operating expenses (Increase: \$12,900)

26.13 Additional requirements relate to the rental and maintenance of word processing equipment in respect of the Treaty Section (\$12,500) and freight and related costs in respect of the International Trade Law Branch (\$400).

#### Other (Increase: \$86,500)

26.14 The additional requirements of \$86,500 under "Other" are covered by redeployment of savings (see para. 26.11 above) from the General Legal Division to the Office of the Legal Counsel in order for the United Nations Institute for Training and Research, in close liaison with the Office of Legal Affairs, to carry out the study on the progressive development of the principles and norms of international law relating to the new international economic order as mandated by the General Assembly in its resolution 35/166.
