CLASSIFICATION CODES

The RID/ADR Joint Meeting adopted the concept of classification codes in Part 2 and Part 3 of the restructured RID/ADR. The codes as proposed (apart from Class 2) are indicated by letters: A, B, C, D etc.

The meaning of these letters differs from Class to Class, for example:

Class 4.3: "F" means water reactive and toxic Class 5.1: "F" means oxidizing and corrosive

Class 2: "F" means flammable.

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It is possible however to use letters which have a meaning of their own.

As in Class 2, it is possible to use letters in order to identify the hazard. As a minimum the following letters can be used :

letter	hazard
F	Flammable
S	Sponteneous combustion
W	Water-reactive
0	Oxidizing
T	Toxic
1	Infectious
R	Radioactive
С	Corrosive
M	Miscellaneous

In addition, it might be useful to use several other letters or combinations of letters, for example

Class 4.1 **DE** = **D**esensitized **E**xplosives **SR** = **S**elf-**R**eactive substances

Class 5.2 **OP** = **O**rganic **P**eroxide

In the addendum to this document the results for Part 2 of the restructured RID/ADR are shown for all Classes. For other parts consequentional amendments are necessary. For Class 1 and Class 2 no changes are proposed.

It is proposed to use the above mentioned letters for the classification codes.

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
