NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

At the 102nd plenary meeting of its thirty-sixth session, on 17 December 1981, the General Assembly adopted resolution 36/172 1/ on the policies of apartheid of the Government of South Africa.

In paragraph 7 of resolution 36/172 A, the General Assembly

"Urges the Security Council to determine that the situation in South Africa, and in southern Africa as a whole, resulting from the policies and actions of the apartheid régime of South Africa constitutes a grave and growing threat to international peace and security and to impose comprehensive and mandatory sanctions against that régime under Chapter VII of the Charter;"

In paragraph 2 of resolution 36/172 C, the General Assembly

"Urges the Security Council to adopt effective measures, under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations, to prevent breaches of the peace and acts of aggression by the <u>apartheid</u> régime, and thereby avert the grave threat to international peace and security;"

In paragraph 3 of resolution 36/172 D, the General Assembly

"Requests the Security Council urgently to consider the above declarations and reports 2/ with a view to the imposition of comprehensive and mandatory sanctions against the apartheid régime of South Africa under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations;"

In paragraphs 2, 5 and 6 of resolution 36/172 E, the General Assembly

- "2. Further condemns the manoeuvres to create a South Atlantic Treaty Organization with the racist régime of South Africa and appeals to the Security Council to undertake measures to ensure that this sinister organization is not established;
- "5. <u>Urges</u> the Security Council to take immediate steps to ensure the scrupulous and full implementation of the arms embargo imposed by the Council in its resolution 418 (1977) and the effective monitoring of the embargo in the light of the report of the Council Committee established by resolution 421 (1977) concerning the question of South Africa on ways and means of making the mandatory arms embargo against South Africa more effective; 3/
- "6. Again requests the Security Council to take mandatory measures to strengthen the arms embargo and secure the immediate cessation of any form of collaboration with the racist régime of South Africa in the military and nuclear fields;"

In paragraph 1 of resolution 36/172 F, the General Assembly

"Urges the Security Council to consider effective measures to reinforce and strengthen the arms embargo against South Africa, taking into account the recommendations of the Council Committee established by resolution 421 (1977) concerning the question of South Africa, the Paris Declaration on Sanctions against South Africa and the Declaration of the International Seminar on the Implementation and Reinforcement of the Arms Embargo against South Africa;" 4/

In paragraph 1 of resolution 36/172 G, the General Assembly

"Again requests the Security Council to consider urgently a mandatory embargo on the supply of petroleum and petroleum products to South Africa under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations;"

In the operative part of resolution 36/172 O, the General Assembly

"Again urges the Security Council to consider the matter at an early date with a view to taking effective steps to achieve the cessation of further foreign investments in, and financial loans to, South Africa."
