## Death and disability benefits

### Note by the Secretary-General

1. The information contained in the annex to the present note is submitted pursuant to paragraphs 16 and 17 of General Assembly resolution 51/239 A of 17 June 1997, in which the Assembly noted that, as at 19 May 1997, a backlog of 564 death and disability claims awaited processing, and requested the Secretary-General to submit to the Assembly quarterly written reports on the progress made in clearing the backlog.
2. Commencing with the first quarterly report, dated 28 October 1997 (A/52/538), eight quarterly progress reports have been issued, presenting information relating to death and disability incidents occurring up to and including 30 June 1997 and indicating the total number of claims from the backlog that had been received since 19 May 1997, as well as the number of claims processed as at 30 June 1999. The most recent update is contained in document A/C.5/53/66.
3. The present document constitutes the ninth quarterly report. The information presented in the attached annex indicates the total number of claims received from troop-contributing countries as at 30 September 1999, identifying the number of claims received since 19 May 1997. This information is presented by country (table A) and by peacekeeping operation (table B). A comparison of the total number of incidents of death and disability reported by peacekeeping operations as at 30 September 1999 and the related number of claims submitted to the Secretariat is presented in table C.
4. In the eighth quarterly report (A/C.5/53/66), it was indicated that a total of 285 claims were awaiting processing as at 30 June 1999. As at 30 September 1999, the total number of claims awaiting processing has increased by 32 to 317. This is the result of

99 new claims having been received and 67 claims having been processed during the period from 1 July to 30 September 1999. Of that total, nine claims represent part of the backlog, as they had been received prior to 19 May 1997. The remaining 58 were received in the period following 19 May 1997.
