Letter from the Minister of Foreign Affairs and Information of South Africa to the Secretary-General

The General Assembly decided on 29 March 1982 to accept Your Excellency's recommendation that Mr. B.C. Mishra be appointed as so-called Commissioner for Namibia.

The South African Government does not and will not recognize the so-called United Nations Council for Namibia and its Commissioner for Namibia.

The South African Government views the appointment of Mr. Mishra as provocative, particularly at this sensitive stage of the negotiations. This appointment again demonstrates that the United Nations has no desire to depart from its adopted course of favouring SWAPO to the exclusion of the democratic parties of the Territory.

The South African Government cannot be held responsible for any detrimental effect which this appointment might have on the delicate negotiation process currently underway.

I would appreciate this letter being circulated as a document of the General Assembly and of the Security Council.

Please accept, Your Excellency, the renewed assurance of my highest consideration.
