NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

At the 91st plenary meeting of its thirty-sixth session session, on 9 December 1981, the General Assembly adopted resolution 36/86, entitled "Implementation of the Declaration on the Denuclearization of Africa".*

In paragraph 3 of resolution 36/86 A, the General Assembly

"Requests the Security Council to intensify its efforts to prohibit all forms of co-operation and collaboration with the racist régime of South Africa in the nuclear field and, in particular, to institute effective enforcement action against that régime so as to prevent it from endangering international peace and security through its acquisition of nuclear weapons".

In paragraph 5 of resolution 36/86 B, the General Assembly

"Requests the Security Council, in keeping with the recommendation of its Committee established by resolution 421 (1977) concerning the question of South Africa, to prohibit all forms of co-operation and collaboration with the racist régime of South Africa in the nuclear field".
