CREDENTIALS OF REPRESENTATIVES TO THE THIRTY-FOURTH SESSION OF
THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Letter dated 19 September 1979 from the Permanent Representative
of Hungary to the United Nations addressed to the President of
the General Assembly and to the Secretary-General

I have the honour to refer to my letter dated 30 May 1979 addressed to the President of the thirty-third session of the General Assembly (A/33/575), in which it was stated that in the view of the Hungarian People's Republic anyone who is not appointed by the People's Revolutionary Council of the People's Republic of Kampuchea has no right to act or speak on behalf of Kampuchea at any international forum.

At the start of the thirty-fourth session of the General Assembly, I wish strongly to reiterate the position of the Government of the Hungarian People's Republic that it fully supports the statement made by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the People's Republic of Kampuchea contained in his message addressed to you on 7 September 1979 (see A/34/460, annex), and holds that only the delegation of the People's Republic of Kampuchea designated by the People's Revolutionary Council of that country to attend the thirty-fourth session of the General Assembly has the right to represent Kampuchea in international relations. Consequently, the seat of Kampuchea at the United Nations must be restored to it. Under the circumstances, the inclusion and discussion of matters concerning Kampuchea in the agenda of the United Nations without the consent and in the absence of the true representatives of the Kampuchean people is inadmissible; it constitutes a flagrant violation of the sovereign rights of that country and is in contravention of the principles of the United Nations.

I request you to circulate this letter as an official document of the General Assembly under item 3 of the provisional agenda.
