SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/14840 of 19 January 1982, S/14840/Add.12 of 5 April 1982 and S/14840/Add.13 of 12 April 1982.

During the week ending 1 May 1982, the Security Council took action on the following item:

Letter dated 31 March 1982 from the President of the Republic of Kenya addressed to the President of the Security Council enclosing the letter dated 18 March 1982 from the President of the Republic of Chad addressed to the President of the Security Council

By a letter dated 31 March 1982 addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/15012), the President of Kenya transmitted the text of a letter of 18 March 1982 from the President of Chad, expressing support for the letter of 2 December 1981 (S/15011) from the President of Kenya, acting in his capacity as current Chairman of the Organization of African Unity, which had solicited assistance, especially financial, from the Security Council, in order to ensure the deployment and maintenance of the Pan-African Peace-keeping Force in Chad.

The Security Council considered the item at its 2358th meeting, held on 30 April 1982.

The President called attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/15013), which had been prepared during the Security Council consultations.

The President then stated that in the absence of objections, he would declare the draft resolution (S/15013) adopted by consensus. There being no objection, the draft resolution was declared adopted by consensus as resolution 504 (1982).

Resolution 504 (1982) reads as follows:

The Security Council,

Having taken note of the letters of President Arap Moi of Kenya, Chairman in office of the Organization of African Unity, dated 2 December 1981 (S/15011) and 31 March 1982 (S/15012), and of the letter of President Goukouni Weddeye of Chad dated 18 March 1982 (S/15012, annex),

Bearing in mind the relevant resolutions of the General Assembly on co-operation between the United Nations and the Organization of African Unity,

1. <u>Takes note</u> of the decision of the Organization of African Unity to establish, in agreement with the Government of the Republic of Chad, a peacekeeping force for the maintenance of peace and security in Chad;

2. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to establish a fund for assistance to the Peace-keeping Force of the Organization of African Unity in Chad, to be supplied by voluntary contributions;

3. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to take the necessary measures to ensure the management of the fund in liaison with the Organization of African Unity.
