SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/14840 of 19 January 1982, S/14840/Add.12 of 5 April 1982 and S/14840/Add.13 of 12 April 1982.

During the week ending 25 September 1982, the Security Council took action on the following item:

The question of South Africa (see S/12269/Add.12, S/12269/Add.13, S/12269/Add.43, S/12269/Add.44, S/12269/Add.49, S/12520/Add.4, S/13033/Add.13, S/13033/Add.37, S/13737/Add.23, S/13737/Add.50, S/14326/Add.5, S/14326/Add.34, S/14326/Add.50 and S/14840/Add.14).

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 2397th meeting, held on 20 September 1982. The Council had before it the report of the Security Council Committee established by resolution 421 (1977) concerning the question of South Africa on ways and means of making the mandatory arms embargo against South Africa more effective (S/14179). The Council continued its discussion at its 2398th meeting, held on 23 September 1982.

At its 2397th meeting, as agreed in consultations held prior to the meeting, the Security Council extended an invitation under rule 39 of its provisional rules of procedure to Ambassador Muñoz Ledo, in his capacity as Chairman for 1981 of the Security Council Committee established by resolution 421 (1977) concerning the question of South Africa.

At the Council's 2398th meeting, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Algeria, Cuba and Ghana, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote. In accordance with his request, dated 21 September 1982, the Security Council extended an invitation under rule 39 of its provisional rules of procedure to the Chairman of the Special Committee against Apartheid.
