Japan: draft resolution

The Security Council,

Recalling its resolution 502 (1982) of 3 April 1982 concerning the situation in the region of the Falkland Islands (Islas Malvinas),

Regretting that resolution 502 (1982) has not yet been implemented,

Gravely concerned at the stalemate of diplomatic efforts to seek a peaceful solution to the differences between the parties, and the subsequent deterioration of the situation in the area,

Reaffirming the fundamental principles of the Charter of the United Nations, in particular the non-use of force and the settlement of international disputes by peaceful means,

- 1. <u>Urges</u> once again that resolution 502 (1982) be implemented in its entirety as soon as possible;
- 2. Reaffirms its support of the good offices of the Secretary-General and requests him to renew the use of his good offices on the basis of his previous efforts as reported in his statement at the 2360th meeting of the Council with a view to achieving the earliest possible cessation of hostilities, realizing a peaceful settlement of the dispute, and securing the implementation of resolution 502 (1982);
- 3. Requests the Secretary-General to report regularly to the Council on the implementation of this resolution.
