LETTER DATED 10 AUGUST 1979 FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON THE SITUATION WITH REGARD TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DECLARATION ON THE GRANTING OF INDEPENDENCE TO COLONIAL COUNTRIES AND PEOPLES ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

I have the honour to transmit herewith, for the attention of the Security Council, the text of a resolution concerning activities of foreign economic and other interests which are impeding the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples in Southern Rhodesia and Namibia and in all other Territories under colonial domination and efforts to eliminate colonialism, <u>apartheid</u> and racial discrimination in southern Africa (A/AC.109/583), adopted by the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples at its 1154th meeting, on 8 August 1979.*

Operative paragraphs 9 and 10 of the resolution read as follows:

"9. <u>Condemns</u> the policies of States which violate the mandatory sanctions imposed by the Security Council, as well as the continued failure of certain Member States to enforce those sanctions against the illegal régime in Southern Rhodesia (Zimbabwe), as being contrary to the obligations assumed by them under Article 25 of the Charter;

"10. <u>Reiterates</u> its conviction that the scope of sanctions against the illegal régime in Southern Rhodesia should be widened to include all the measures envisaged under Article 41 of the Charter and invites the Security Council to consider the adoption of appropriate measures in that regard;".
