I. INTRODUCTION

1. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 19 September 1980, the General Assembly decided to include in the agenda of its thirty-fifth session the item entitled "Programme budget for the biennium 1980-1981" and to allocate it to the Fifth Committee.
2. The Fifth Committee considered the item at its 8th to 12th, 20th, 26th to 34th, 36th to 49th, 51st, 52nd, 55th, and 58th to 63rd meetings, on 2, 3, 6, 8, 9, 20, 28 to 31 October, 3, 4, 12, 19, 21, 24 to 26 and 28 November, 1 to 6, 8 to 11, 13 and 15 to 17 December 1980.
3. The comments and observations made in the course of the discussion of this item are reflected in the relevant summary records (A/C.5/35/SR.8-12, 20, 26-34, 36-49, 51, 52, 55 and 58-63).
4. Section II of the present report contains a summary of the recommendations of the Fifth Committee during the current session on the revised estimates submitted by the Secretary-General as well as on the financial implications of resolutions adopted by the General Assembly either on the recommendation of its Main Committees or in respect of items dealt with by the plenary.
5. Section III of the present report provides a summary of the special subjects considered by the Fifth Committee, other than the administrative and financial implications of draft resolutions recommended by other Main Committees, which led to the adoption of specific decisions to be recommended to the General Assembly.
6. The recommendations of the Fifth Committee are contained in section IV of the present report.

II. PROGRAMME BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM 1980-1981

7. By its resolutions 34/230 A and B of 20 December 1979, the General Assembly approved appropriations for the biennium 1980-1981 in the amount of \$1,247,793,200 and estimates of income in the amount of \$221,343,200.
8. Recommendations of the Fifth Committee during the current session of the General Assembly on revised estimates submitted by the Secretary-General as well as on the financial implications of resolutions adopted by the Assembly under items considered by other Main Committees, have involved additional appropriations in the amount of \$91,358,000 and additional estimates of income in the amount of \$16,989,900. DECISIONS OF THE COMMITTEE

10. At its 63rd meeting, on 17 December, the Fifth Committee considered the revised estimates of income and expenditure to be recommended for approval by the General Assembly for the biennium 1980-1981, as well as the financing of the appropriations for the year 1981.

III. CONSIDERATION OF SPECIAL SUBJECTS

1. Depositary functions of the Secretary-General and registration and publication of treaties

12. The Committee considered this question at its 8th and 9th meetings, on 2 and 3 October. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/34/40 and Corr.1 and 2), the consideration of which had been deferred from the thirty-fourth session (see A/C.5/34/SR.84, paras. 69-81), and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/35/7/Add.1).

13. At its 9th meeting, the Committee approved an additional appropriation of \$346,000 under sections 26, 28D and 29A of the programme budget for the biennium 1980-1981, with a corresponding amount of \$61,400 under section 31 (Staff assessment) offset by an equivalent amount under income section 1 (Income from staff assessment), and decided to recommend that the General Assembly should endorse the recommendations made by the Advisory Committee in paragraphs 11 and 12 of its report (A/35/7/Add.1) (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. I).

2. Services provided by the United Nations to activities financed from extrabudgetary resources

14. The Committee considered this question at its 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th meetings, on 3, 6, 8 and 9 October. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/34/21), which had been deferred from the thirty-fourth session (A/34/848, para. 121 (b)). The Committee also had before it a report of the Advisory Committee on the subject (A/35/7/Add.2).

15. At the 11th meeting, on 8 October, the representative of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics proposed the following draft decision:

"The General Assembly requests the Secretary-General to continue to submit reports on services provided by the United Nations to activities financed from extrabudgetary resources."

16. At the 12th meeting, on 9 October, on a proposal by the Chairman which incorporated the proposal of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, the Fifth Committee decided, without objection, to recommend that the General Assembly should take note of the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/34/21) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/35/7/Add.2), that it should endorse the recommendations made by the Advisory Committee in paragraph 24 of its report, and that it should request the Secretary-General to submit, as a separate annex to future proposed programme budgets, all the necessary information on services provided by the United Nations to activities financed from extrabudgetary resources (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. II).

3. Procedures governing the disposal of property

17. The Committee considered this question at its 26th meeting, on 28 October. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/30), prepared in response to General Assembly resolution 34/228 of 20 December 1979. At the same meeting, the Chairman of the Advisory Committee made an oral report to the Fifth Committee on the deliberations of the Advisory Committee on the question.

18. The Fifth Committee decided, without objection, to recommend that the General Assembly should take note of the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/30) and the related oral report of the Advisory Committee and that it should request the Secretary-General to implement the procedures recommended in paragraph 15 of his report, and to apply those procedures when drawing up the proposed programme budget for the biennium 1982-1983 (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. III).

4. Programme for training English and French translators/précis-writers at the Economic Commission for Africa

19. The Committee considered this question at its 26th meeting, on 28 October. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General on the subject (A/C.5/35/29).

20. At the same meeting, the Chairman of the Advisory Committee presented orally the report of that Committee.

21. At the same meeting, the Fifth Committee decided, without objection, to recommend that the General Assembly should take note of the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/29) and the related oral report of the Advisory Committee, that it should authorize the Secretary-General to incur the necessary expenses for the third training programme and request him to submit to the Assembly at its thirty-sixth session a report containing an evaluation of the training programmes of the previous biennia, to be considered by the Assembly prior to the appropriation of any funds for the fourth training programme (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. IV).

5. Revised estimates resulting from decisions of the Economic and Social Council at its first and second regular sessions of 1980 (Part I)

22. The Committee considered this question at its 26th and 27th meetings, on 28 and 29 October. It had before it part I of the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/23 and Corr.1) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/35/7/Add.5).

23. At the 27th meeting, one delegation requested a separate vote on the proposed additional appropriation of \$57,600, under section 23 of the programme budget, attributable to Economic and Social Council decision 1980/129. The Committee decided, by 72 votes to 5, with 28 abstentions, to include the amount of \$57,600 under section 23 of the programme budget for the biennium 1980-1981.

24. The Committee then approved, without objection, additional appropriations attributable to resolutions and decisions of the Economic and Social Council during its first and second regular sessions of 1980 as follows: section 9 - \$57,600; section 22 - \$22,200; section 23 - \$196,600; section 28 - \$55,200; and an increase of \$30,700 under section 31 (Staff assessment), offset by an equivalent amount under income section 1 (Income from staff assessment).

6. Agency support costs

25. The Committee considered this matter at its 26th and 29th meetings, on 28 October and 3 November, at which time it had before it a report by the Advisory Committee (A/35/544 and Corr.1).

26. At its 29th meeting, the Fifth Committee decided, by a recorded vote of 84 to 10, to recommend that the General Assembly should approve the reimbursement formula embodied in decision 80/44 of 27 June 1980 of the Governing Council of the United Nations Development Programme 1/ (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. V). The voting was as follows:

7. United Nations Conference on Trade and Development: advances from the Working Capital Fund for the International Natural Rubber Council and the Common Fund

27. At its 29th meeting, on 3 November, the Committee took up the question of advances from the Working Capital Fund of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) for both the International Natural Rubber Council and the Common Fund. The Committee had before it a note by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/22) regarding interim arrangements for the International Natural Rubber Council and a note by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/19) on the preparatory work for bringing the Common Fund into operation, and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/35/7/Add.3).

28. The Committee, by a recorded vote of 86 to 0, with 9 abstentions, decided to inform the General Assembly that, should it approve the Secretary-General's requests, additional appropriations of \$1,950,500 under section 15 and \$217,600 under section 31 of the programme budget for the biennium 1980-1981 would be required. Furthermore, the approved estimates of income would have to be increased by \$217,600 under income section 1 and by \$1,950,500 under income section 2. The voting was as follows:

8. Revised estimates under section 19 (United Nations Centre for Human Settlements (Habitat)): resources for the work programme at the regional level

29. The Committee considered this question at its 32nd meeting, on 19 November. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/31) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/35/7/Add.6).

30. At the same meeting, the Fifth Committee approved, without objection, an appropriation of \$330,000 under section 19 of the programme budget for the biennium 1980-1981 and a consequential appropriation of \$74,500 under section 31 (Staff assessment), to be offset by an equivalent amount under income section 1 (Income from staff assessment). The Committee also decided to endorse the recommendations made by the Advisory Committee in paragraph 6 of its report (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. VI).

9. Workload standards for technical and complementary conference-servicing staff

31. The Committee considered this question at its 33rd meeting, on 21 November 1980. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/28) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/35/7/Add.7).

32. The Committee decided, without objection, to endorse the recommendations made by the Advisory Committee in paragraphs 9 and 10 of its report, and to take note of the fact that the Advisory Committee will revert to this question when it considers the proposed programme budget for 1982-1983 (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. VII).

10. Comprehensive study of the question of honoraria payable to members of organs and subsidiary organs of the United Nations

33. The Committee considered this question at its 34th, 36th and 38th meetings on 24, 25 and 26 November. It had before it a comprehensive study of the question of honoraria payable to members of organs and subsidiary organs of the United Nations (A/C.5/31/2), prepared by the Secretary-General pursuant to a request by the General Assembly in resolution 3536 (XXX). It also had before it a report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/33/54), prepared at the request of the Advisory Committee as a supplement to the information provided in the study, and the related report of the Advisory Committee submitted to the Assembly at its thirty-third session (A/33/7/Add.39).

34. At the 34th meeting, on 24 November, the representative of Mexico introduced the following draft resolution (A/C.5/35/L.21):

"The General Assembly,

"Having considered the reports of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/1677 and Corr.1, A/C.5/31/2 and A/C.5/33/54) and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/33/7/Add.39),

"Reaffirming the principle enunciated in its resolution 2489 (XXIII) of 21 December 1968, according to which neither a fee nor any other remuneration in addition to subsistence allowances at the standard rate shall normally be paid to members of organs or subsidiary organs unless expressly decided upon by the General Assembly,

"1. Decides that, with effect from 1 January 1981, the following revised rates of honoraria shall be payable in those cases which it has already authorized on an exceptional basis, namely, the International Law Commission, the International Narcotics Control Board, the United Nations Administrative Tribunal and the Human Rights Committee:

"2. Requests the Secretary-General to keep the above rates of honoraria under review and to report thereon to the General Assembly when, in his judgement, their revision by the Assembly might be warranted."

35. At the 38th meeting, on 26 November, the representative of Egypt orally proposed amendments to the draft resolution of Mexico in respect of the recommended rates of honoraria for Chairmen (Presidents), the Vice-Chairman of the International Narcotics Control Board and other members, which provided for the replacement of the figures 4,000, 2,500 and 1,500 in the table in operative paragraph 1 of draft resolution A/C.5/35/L.21 by the figures 5,000, 4,000 and 3,000, and the deletion of the words "(except that this additional amount shall not be payable to the Chairman, if he acts as Special Rapporteur)" in the same table. The representative of Mexico accepted the amendments.

36. The Committee voted on the draft resolution as follows:

(a) Operative paragraph 2 was adopted by 50 votes to 13, with 19 abstentions.

(b) The draft resolution as a whole, as amended, was adopted by 53 votes to 11, with 19 abstentions (see para. 115, draft resolution II).

11. Arabic language services

37. The Committee considered this question at its 28th, 29th, 30th, 34th and 46th meetings on 31 October, 3, 4 and 24 November and on 4 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/18 and Corr.1), submitted in compliance with General Assembly resolution 34/226 of 20 December 1979. The report of the Advisory Committee was presented orally at the 28th meeting, on 31 October.

38. At the 34th meeting, on 24 November, the representative of Morocco introduced a draft resolution on behalf of Algeria, Argentina, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Benin, Chad, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Democratic Yemen, Djibouti, Ecuador, Egypt, France, Iraq, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Madagascar, Maldives, Mauritania, Mexico, Morocco, Oman, Pakistan, Panama, the Philippines, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Sudan, the Syrian Arab Republic, Tunisia, Turkey, the United Arab Emirates, Yemen and Yugoslavia, later joined by the Central African Republic, Chile, Hungary, Malaysia and Mali (A/C.5/35/L.19).

39. A statement of administrative and financial implications (A/C.5/35/82) was submitted by the Secretary-General as well as a note by the Secretariat setting out the changes that would be required in the rules of procedure of the General Assembly (A/C.5/35/L.30) if the draft resolution were adopted by the Assembly.

40. At its 46th meeting, on 4 December, the Fifth Committee adopted, without objection, draft resolution A/C.5/35/L.19, and decided to recommend that the General Assembly should adopt, at its current session, the amendments to its rules of procedure as proposed in the note by the Secretariat (A/C.5/35/L.30), on the understanding that the new texts would take effect as of the date of the implementation of operative paragraph 1 of draft resolution A/C.5/35/L.19. Corresponding changes in the rules of subsidiary organs of the Assembly that have adopted their own rules of procedure would need to be made by the organs concerned. (See para. 115, draft resolutions III A and B.)

41. The representatives of Spain and the United Kingdom made statements in explanation of position.

12. Revised programme budget of the United Nations
Industrial Development Organization for 1981

42. The Committee considered this question at its 45th meeting, on 4 December. It had before it a note by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/44 and Corr.1) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/35/7/Add.20).

43. The representative of Morocco, in an oral statement, proposed that the full amount requested by the Secretary-General in his report (A/C.5/35/44 and Corr.1) should be approved by the Fifth Committee.

44. The Fifth Committee then, by 57 votes to 29, with 13 abstentions, approved on first reading an additional appropriation of \$396,300 under section 17 of the

programme budget for 1980-1981, as well as an appropriation of \$78,100 under section 31 (Staff assessment), to be offset by an increase in the same amount under income section 1 (Income from staff assessment).

13. Emoluments of and pension scheme for the members of the International Court of Justice

45. The Committee considered this question at its 36th and 44th meetings, on 25 November and 3 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/33) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/35/7/Add.10).

46. At its 44th meeting, on 3 December, the Fifth Committee decided, by 73 votes to 10, with 4 abstentions, to recommend to the General Assembly the adoption of the draft resolutions contained in the annex to the report of the Advisory Committee (see para. 115, draft resolutions IV A and B).

14. Reclassification of regular-budget posts

47. The Committee considered this question at its 47th meeting, on 5 December. It had before it the report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/35/7/Add.8) on the reclassification of regular-budget posts.

48. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, without objection, to recommend that the General Assembly should take note of the report of the Advisory Committee (A/35/7/Add.8) and endorse the recommendations contained in paragraphs 41 to 44 thereof (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. VIII).

15. Revised estimates resulting from resolutions and decisions adopted by the Trade and Development Board at its twentieth and twenty-first sessions

49. The Committee considered this question at its 44th and 47th meetings, on 3 and 5 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/46) on revised estimates resulting from resolutions and decisions adopted by the Trade and Development Board at its twentieth and twenty-first sessions, held at Geneva from 17 to 26 March and from 15 to 27 September 1980; the related report of the Advisory Committee was presented orally by its Chairman.

50. At the 47th meeting, on 5 December, the representative of Belgium, on behalf of the Member States of the European Economic Community, proposed that the Fifth Committee should decide that the credits and appropriations foreseen by resolution 216 (XX) of the Trade and Development Board for meetings of intergovernmental experts should not be drawn from the regular budget and that the Committee should request the Secretary-General to remove the corresponding amount from the consolidated statement of conference-servicing costs.

51. The proposal was rejected by a recorded vote of 63 to 30, with 1 abstention. The vote was as follows:

The Committee then decided, without objection, to recommend that the General Assembly should take note of the report of the Secretary-General contained in document A/C.5/35/46 (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. IX). It also decided that the conference-servicing costs for the meetings foreseen for 1981, pursuant to resolutions and decisions adopted by the Trade and Development Board, which should not exceed \$611,678, would be examined in the context of the consolidated statement of conference-servicing costs to be submitted towards the end of the current session of the Assembly.

16. Conditions of service and compensation for officials, other than Secretariat officials, serving the General Assembly

53. The Committee considered this question at its 46th and 48th meetings, on 4 and 6 December. It had before it a report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/53), regarding conditions of service and compensation for officials, other than Secretariat officials, serving the General Assembly.

54. At the 46th meeting, on 4 December, the representative of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland introduced a draft resolution (A/C.5/35/L.32).

55. At the same meeting, the representative of Panama introduced a draft decision (A/C.5/35/L.33) reading as follows:

"The Fifth Committee decides to request the Secretary-General to examine the possibility of devising a special system of grants and allowances, including post-retirement benefits distinct from the common system arrangements, for the Chairman and the Vice-Chairman of the International Civil Service Commission and the Chairman of the Advisory Committee for Administrative and Budgetary Questions, and to report thereon to the General Assembly at its thirty-sixth session."

56. At the 48th meeting, on 6 December, the Committee was informed that Panama wished to withdraw its draft decision (A/C.5/35/L.33).

57. The Committee then adopted, without objection, draft resolution A/C.5/35/L.32 (see para. 115, draft resolution V).

17. United Nations accommodation at Nairobi

58. The Committee considered this question at its 37th, 38th, 40th, 41st, 42nd, 47th and 48th meetings, on 26 November and 1, 2, 5 and 6 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/35), the report of the Executive Director of the United Nations Environment Programme (A/C.5/35/35/Add.1) regarding United Nations accommodation at Nairobi and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/35/7/Add.11).

59. At the 47th meeting of the Committee, on 5 December, the representative of Kenya introduced a draft resolution (A/C.5/35/L.27), which read as follows:

"The General Assembly,

"Having considered the reports of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/35) and the Executive Director of the United Nations Environment Programme (A/C.5/35/35/Add.1),

"Recalling its resolution 32/208 of 21 December 1977 in which it approved the construction of the permanent headquarters facilities for the United Nations Environment Programme at Nairobi,

"Recalling further its resolution 34/233, section XI, of 20 December 1979, in which it approved additional office space and conference facilities for Habitat,

"Taking into account that the United Nations accommodation at Nairobi is the first such accommodation to be established in a developing country,

"1. Expresses its appreciation to the Secretary-General and the Executive Director of the United Nations Environment Programme for their efforts to provide the General Assembly with a more economic alternative for the accommodation of the United Nations at Nairobi;

"2. Decides to approve the proposals contained in the report of the Executive Director (A/C.5/35/35/Add.1) with the addition of the two major conference rooms as envisaged in the original project as approved by the General Assembly in 1977 and the necessary adjustment of catering, library and documentation facilities within the total appropriation of 254,944,000 Kenyan shillings approved by the General Assembly in 1979;

"3. Requests the Secretary-General to proceed, without delay, with the construction and to submit a progress report to the General Assembly at its thirty-sixth session and on an annual basis thereafter until the project is completed."

The representative of Kenya orally revised the draft resolution by:

(a) Adding a new second preambular paragraph reading:

"Having also considered the report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/35/7/Add.11)";

(b) Replacing the words "with the addition of" in operative paragraph 2 by the words "and also decides to restore".

60. At the 48th meeting, on 6 December, the Committee had before it a revised text (A/C.5/35/L.27/Rev.1) of the draft resolution. The draft resolution, as revised, was sponsored by Burundi, Kenya, Mauritania, Malawi, Panama, Senegal and the Sudan.

61. At the same meeting, the Committee, by a recorded vote of 83 to 9, with 7 abstentions, adopted draft resolution A/C.5/35/L.27/Rev.1 (see para. 115, draft resolution VI). The voting was as follows: 2/

In favour: Algeria, Argentina, Austria, Bahamas, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Barbados, Benin, Bolivia, Brazil, Burundi, Central African Republic, Chad, China, Congo, Democratic Yemen, Denmark, Djibouti, Ecuador, Egypt, Fiji, Finland, Gabon, Ghana, Greece, Guinea, Guyana, India, Indonesia, Iraq, Ireland, Ivory Coast, Japan, Jordan, Kenya, Kuwait, Lebanon, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Madagascar, Malaysia, Mauritania, Mexico, Morocco, Mozambique, Netherlands, New Zealand, Niger, Nigeria, Norway, Oman, Pakistan, Panama, Peru, Philippines, Portugal, Qatar, Romania, Rwanda, Saudi Arabia, Senegal, Singapore, Somalia, Spain, Sudan, Sweden, Syrian Arab Republic, Thailand, Togo, Trinidad and Tobago, Tunisia, Turkey, Uganda, United Arab Emirates, United Republic of Cameroon, United Republic of Tanzania, United States of America, Upper Volta, Uruguay, Venezuela, Yemen, Yugoslavia, Zaire, Zambia.

2/ Subsequently, the delegations of Malawi and Swaziland indicated that, had they been present during the voting, they would have voted in favour.

Against: Bulgaria, Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, Czechoslovakia, German Democratic Republic, Hungary, Mongolia, Poland, Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

Abstaining: Australia, Belgium, Canada, France, Germany, Federal Republic of, Italy, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

18. First-class travel in the United Nations

62. The Committee considered this question at its 47th and 48th meetings, on 5 and 6 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/62) on first-class travel in the United Nations and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/35/7/Add.17).

63. At the 48th meeting, on 6 December, the representative of India made an oral proposal which he later withdrew; the representative of Senegal also made an oral proposal.

64. The Committee then decided, without objection, to recommend that the General Assembly should:

(a) Take note of the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/62) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/35/7/Add.17);

(b) Decide to amend the provisions of paragraph 2 (a) of its resolution 32/198 of 21 December 1977 as follows:

"(a) The Secretary-General, the Director-General for Development and International Economic Co-operation and one representative of each Member State attending regular, special or emergency special sessions of the General Assembly shall be entitled to first-class travel";

(c) Request that the report to be submitted by the Secretary-General on this subject to the General Assembly at its thirty-sixth session should cover the period from 1 October 1980 to 30 June 1981 so as to enable the Fifth Committee to consider it at the beginning of the session and that, thereafter, reports should be submitted annually to cover the period from 1 July to 30 June of the following year;

(d) Request the Secretary-General to prepare a study on the conditions for travel of permanent representatives accredited to the United Nations when travelling on official missions on behalf of the Organization (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. X).

19. Revised estimates resulting from decisions of the Economic and Social Council at its first and second regular sessions of 1980 (Part II)

65. The Committee considered this question at its 49th meeting, on 8 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/23/Add.1 and Corr.1) regarding the revised estimates resulting from decisions of the Economic and Social Council at its first and second regular sessions of 1980 (Part II) and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/35/7/Add.16).

66. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, without objection, to approve an additional appropriation of \$128,100 under section 12 of the programme budget for the biennium 1980-1981, as well as an additional appropriation of \$9,600 under section 31 (Staff assessment), to be offset by an equivalent amount under income section 1 (Income from staff assessment).

20. Revised estimates under section 27 (Public information): Development Forum

67. The Committee considered this question at its 49th meeting, on 8 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/52) regarding the revised estimates under section 27 (Public information), and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/35/7/Add.19).

68. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, without objection, to approve an additional appropriation of \$200,000 under section 27 of the programme budget for the biennium 1980-1981. The Committee further decided to take note of the comments made by the Advisory Committee in paragraph 11 of its report (A/35/7/Add.19) (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. XI).

21. Organizational nomenclature in the Secretariat

69. The Committee considered this question at its 49th meeting, on 8 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/47) on organizational nomenclature in the Secretariat.

70. At the same meeting, the Committee decided to recommend to the General Assembly that it should take note of the report of the Secretary-General (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. XII).

22. Establishment of an Information Systems Unit in the Department of International Economic and Social Affairs

71. The Committee considered this question at its 36th, 44th, 45th, 46th, 48th and 49th meetings, held on 25 November and 3, 4, 6 and 8 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/32 and Corr.1) on the establishment of the Information Systems Unit in the Department of International Economic and Social Affairs and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/35/7/Add.9).

72. At the 44th meeting, on 3 December, the representative of the United States of America submitted a draft resolution (A/C.5/35/L.26) on the question, which read as follows:

"The General Assembly,

"Recalling its resolutions 32/212, section V, 33/116 A, section II, and 34/233, section I,

"Having considered the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/32 and Corr.1) and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/35/7/Add.9),

"1. Extends its sincere appreciation to those Member States that have generously supported through voluntary contributions the Information Systems Unit of the Department of International Economic and Social Affairs;

"2. Suggests that the Secretary-General, should he wish to continue the unit on a limited basis, may explore arrangements whereby the unit would be reimbursed for its work by the users, and supplemented by soliciting voluntary funding;

"3. Recommends that future users within and outside the United Nations system reimburse the unit for the costs of services;

"4. Decides not to include the Information Systems Unit in the regular budget of the United Nations for the reasons contained in the report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions;

"5. Reiterates its request, contained in resolution 34/233, section I, that the Inter-Organization Board for Information Systems report to the General Assembly on the Information Systems Unit, with particular emphasis on the co-ordination of the Information Systems Unit with other information systems in the United Nations system."

73. At the 45th meeting, on 4 December, the representative of Canada introduced the following draft decision (A/C.5/35/L.28), on behalf of Canada, Mauritania, Panama, Somalia, Sweden and the Sudan:

"The General Assembly decides that the salaries and common staff costs of the basic staffing complement of the Development Information System of the Information Systems Unit, consisting of two Professional posts (one P-4 and

one P-2) and two General Service posts (one G-5 and one G-3), should be funded temporarily by the regular budget for 1981, that other operating and servicing costs should be financed through a combination of revenues generated by the services rendered to its users, extrabudgetary support costs financing and voluntary contributions, that the System should be submitted to continued external evaluation and that a report thereon should be circulated to delegations in good time so that the Assembly at its thirty-sixth session may pronounce itself on the possible continuance and methods of financing of the Information Systems Unit."

74. At the 48th meeting, on 6 December, the representative of the United States of America introduced a revised text (A/C.5/35/L.26/Rev.1) of the draft resolution, which read as follows:

"The General Assembly,

"Recalling its resolutions 32/212, section V, 33/116 A, section II, and 34/233, section I,

"Having considered the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/32 and Corr.1) and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/35/7/Add.9),

"1. Extend its sincere appreciation to those Member States that have generously supported through voluntary contributions the Information Systems Unit of the Department of International Economic and Social Affairs;

"2. Suggests that the Unit should be maintained and requests the Secretary-General to undertake studies concerning arrangements whereby the Unit would be reimbursed for the services it provides to users through voluntary contributions;

"3. Recommends that future users within the United Nations system reimburse the Unit for the costs of services;

"4. Decides to defer financing of the Unit from the regular budget pending the submission by the Inter-Organization Board of a report to the General Assembly on the Information Systems Unit and in particular on the co-ordination of the latter with the other information systems of the United Nations system;

"5. Further decides that remuneration of staff of the Unit during the year 1981 should be absorbed within funds already allocated to the regular budget for 1981;

"6. Requests the Secretary-General to report to the General Assembly at its thirty-sixth session regarding possible areas of duplication or overlap of the work of the Information Systems Unit and the United Nations Bibliographic Information System, together with suggestions regarding means of eliminating any duplication or overlap that may be found."

75. At the same meeting, the representative of Canada, on behalf of the sponsors of draft decision A/C.5/35/L.28, orally revised the text by deleting the words "revenues generated by the services rendered to its users".

76. At its 49th meeting, the Committee proceeded to vote on draft resolution A/C.5/35/L.26/Rev.1 and draft decision A/C.5/35/L.28/Rev.1:

(a) Draft resolution A/C.5/35/L.26/Rev.1 was rejected by 33 votes to 22, with 47 abstentions;

(b) Draft decision A/C.5/35/L.28/Rev.1 was adopted by 73 votes to 15, with 18 abstentions (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. XIII).

23. International Computing Centre: 1981 budget estimates

Revised estimates under section 28G (Electronic Data Processing and Information Systems Division - International Computing Centre, Geneva (United Nations share))

77. The Committee considered these questions at its 55th meeting, on 11 December. It had before it a report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/97); the Chairman of the Advisory Committee orally presented the report of that Committee.

78. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, without objection, to recommend that the General Assembly should approve the 1981 budget estimates for the International Computing Centre, as submitted in document A/C.5/35/97, totalling \$5,037,000. No additional appropriation would be required during the current session of the Assembly under section 28G of the programme budget for the biennium 1980-1981. Such additional requirements as might arise would be considered in the context of the budget performance report to be submitted by the Secretary-General to the Assembly at its thirty-sixth session (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. XIV).

24. United Nations accommodation at Santiago

79. The Committee considered this question at its 58th meeting, on 13 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/80); the Chairman of the Advisory Committee orally presented the report of that Committee.

80. At the same meeting, the Committee decided by 80 votes to 9, with 1 abstention, to recommend that the General Assembly should take note of the Secretary-General's report (A/C.5/35/80) and authorize him to undertake the architectural and engineering study referred to therein, on the understanding that no additional appropriations would be required for the programme budget for the biennium 1980-1981. It further requested the Secretary-General to exert every effort to cover the related costs within existing appropriations, on the understanding that such additional requirements as might arise would be considered in the context of the budget performance report to be submitted by the Secretary-General to the General Assembly at its thirty-sixth session (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. XV).

25. Development and international economic co-operation:
restructuring of the economic and social sectors of
the United Nations system

81. The Committee considered this question at its 59th meeting, on 15 December. It had before it a communication from the Vice-Chairman of the Second Committee on behalf of the Chairman of the Second Committee (A/C.5/35/L.25) as well as part VII of the report of the Second Committee (A/35/592/Add.6).

82. At the same meeting, the representative of Jamaica introduced a draft resolution (A/C.5/35/L.43) sponsored by Barbados, Chad, Ghana, Jamaica, Kenya, Panama and Saint Lucia.

83. The representative of Jamaica orally revised operative paragraph 2 of the draft resolution by inserting after the words "Committee for Programme and Co-ordination regarding" the words "a study of the impact on the Secretariat of". The name of Chad was deleted from the list of sponsors.

84. The Committee then decided, without objection, to adopt draft resolution A/C.5/35/L.43, as orally revised (see para. 115, draft resolution VII).

26. Transfer of the Experts Servicing Unit from the United
Nations Office at Geneva to the United Nations
Conference on Trade and Development

85. The Committee considered this question at its 59th meeting, held on 15 December 1980. It had before it a report by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/51) on this subject.

86. The Committee decided, without objection, to take note of the report of the Secretary-General (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. XVI).

27. Emoluments of the Secretary-General

87. The Committee considered this question at its 60th meeting, on 15 December. It had before it the report of the Advisory Committee (A/35/7/Add.30), the annex to which contained a draft resolution.

88. The Committee then adopted the draft resolution without objection (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. XVII).

28. Use of experts and consultants in the United Nations

89. The Committee considered this question at its 59th and 61st meetings, on 15 December. At its 59th meeting, the Director of the Budget made an oral report on the subject.

90. At the 61st meeting, the representative of Poland, on behalf of Poland and Trinidad and Tobago, introduced a draft resolution (A/C.5/35/L.53), which he then orally revised by adding the words "to be" after the word "information" in operative paragraph 4.

91. The representative of the United Republic of Cameroon proposed that operative paragraph 3 of the draft resolution should be amended by the replacement of the words "Reiterates its request to" by the words "Requests again that". The sponsors accepted this amendment.

92. The Committee then adopted, without objection, draft resolution A/C.5/35/L.53, as orally revised (see para. 115, draft resolution VIII).

29. Job classification and career development
of language staff

93. The Committee considered this question at its 58th, 60th and 61st meetings, on 13 and 15 December. It had before it a report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/75) on the subject and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/35/7/Add.27).

94. At the 58th meeting, on 13 December, the representative of Morocco introduced a draft resolution (A/C.5/35/L.45).

95. At the 60th meeting on 15 December, the representative of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics requested a separate vote on paragraph 1 of draft resolution A/C.5/35/L.45.

96. At the 61st meeting, on 15 December, the representative of Australia proposed an amendment to the last preambular paragraph, replacing the word "new" by the words "more recently introduced official". The representative of Morocco accepted the amendment.

97. The Committee then proceeded to vote on draft resolution A/C.5/35/L.45 as follows:

(a) Operative paragraph 1 of the draft resolution was adopted by 86 votes to 8, with 2 abstentions;

(b) The draft resolution as a whole, as orally amended, was adopted by 87 votes to none, with 9 abstentions (see para. 115, draft resolution IX).

30. Common services at Nairobi

98. The Committee considered this question at its 61st meeting, on 15 December. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/114).

99. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, without objection, to take note of the report of the Secretary-General (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. XVIII).

31. Revised estimates: Centre for Science and Technology
for Development

United Nations Interim Fund for Science and Technology for
Development

100. The Committee considered this question at its 61st meeting, on 15 December. It had before it a report by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/83) on the revised estimates for the Centre, report of the Secretary-General on the staff and other administrative costs for the United Nations Interim Fund for Science and Technology (A/C.5/35/91) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/35/7/Add.32).

101. At the same meeting, the representative of Venezuela proposed that the Committee should approve the resources required by the Secretary-General in his report (A/C.5/35/83), including the conversion of temporary posts to established posts and the reclassification of one P-5 post to the D-1 level.

102. The Committee decided, by a recorded vote of 65 to 23, with 3 abstentions, to approve the proposal by Venezuela. The voting was as follows:

In favour: Afghanistan, Algeria, Argentina, Bahamas, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Barbados, Benin, Brazil, Burundi, Central African Republic, Chile, China, Colombia, Congo, Costa Rica, Cuba, Egypt, Ethiopia, Germany, Federal Republic of, Ghana, Guyana, India, Indonesia, Iran, Italy, Kenya, Kuwait, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Madagascar, Malawi, Malaysia, Mali, Mauritania, Mexico, Morocco, Mozambique, Niger, Nigeria, Oman, Pakistan, Panama, Peru, Philippines, Qatar, Rcrania, Rwanda, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, Somalia, Sudan, Swaziland, Syrian Arab Republic, Thailand, Togo, Trinidad and Tobago, Uganda, United Republic of Cameroon, United Republic of Tanzania, Upper Volta, Uruguay, Venezuela, Yugoslavia, Zaire, Zambia.

Against: Australia, Belgium, Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, Canada, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, Finland, France, German Democratic Republic, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Mongolia, Netherlands, New Zealand, Poland, Portugal, Spain, Sweden, Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America.

Abstaining: Ivory Coast, Japan, Turkey.

103. Accordingly, the Committee approved additional appropriations in the total amount of \$821,900, distributed as follows:

Section 4	(Policy-making organs (economic and social activities))	(\$169,200)
Section 5B	(Centre for Science and Technology for Development)	\$2,212,700
Section 6	(Department of International Economic and Social Affairs)	(\$1,284,900)
Section 28	(Administration, management and general services)	\$63,300

It also approved an additional appropriation of \$129,400 under section 31 (Staff assessment), to be offset by an increase of the same amount under income section 1 (Income from staff assessment). The Committee also approved the conversion of the temporary posts into established posts and the reclassification of the P-5 post to the D-1 level, as requested by the Secretary-General. It further decided that the related conference-servicing costs, not exceeding \$546,300, would be considered separately within the context of the consolidated statement of conference-servicing costs.

104. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, without objection, to recommend that the General Assembly should take note of the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/91) and the related report of the Advisory Committee (A/35/7/Add.32, paras. 15-18) and authorize the Administrator of the United Nations Development Programme to incur the staff and other administrative costs within the level indicated for 1981 in the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/91) (see para. 115, draft resolution I, sect. XIX).

32. Establishment of a child-care centre at Headquarters

105. The Committee considered this question at its 61st meeting, on 15 December. It had before it a report submitted by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/76) on the subject. The report of the Advisory Committee was presented orally by its Chairman.

106. At the same meeting, the representative of Costa Rica introduced a draft resolution (A/C.5/35/L.52) on behalf of Costa Rica, Ecuador and Guatemala, which read as follows:

"The General Assembly,

"Recalling that, as early as 1975, it decided to request the organs concerned to determine the need for the provision of day-care facilities for the children of the staff of the United Nations,

/...

"Recalling further that in its report on women in the Professional category and above in the United Nations system, submitted to the General Assembly at its thirty-third session, the Joint Inspection Unit recommended the establishment of child-care facilities for children of United Nations staff members, particularly at the Headquarters of the Organization in New York,

"Noting that the World Conference of the United Nations Decade for Women: Equality, Development and Peace, called for the implementation of the recommendations of the General Assembly and of the Joint Inspection Unit in its resolution 24 on 'Women in the United Nations Secretariat',

"Noting further that in 1979, the International Year of the Child, a desk-to-desk survey was conducted by the Staff Council to quantify the needs of working parents at United Nations Headquarters with respect to child care for children in several age brackets,

"Decides to accept the recommendation contained in the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/76) and to establish day-care facilities for the children of the staff of the United Nations, including the provision of service to the United Nations community, i.e., delegation personnel, should conditions permit,

"Requests the Secretary-General to take the necessary measures for the immediate commencement of the construction of facilities for the child-care centre in the space envisaged in order to avoid an increase in construction costs (A/C.5/35/76, para. 14),

"Urges the Secretary-General to take the necessary measures to ensure that all children of staff members whose circumstances so require will be accepted in the child-care facilities even if the quota has been filled, if the case is a deserving one,

"Requests the Secretary-General, taking into account the various aspects of the proposal, to enable the day-care facilities to commence operations at Headquarters in September 1981, at least for United Nations staff members' children in the 1 to 6 age group."

107. Following a debate on the question, the representative of Costa Rica withdrew the draft resolution.

108. Recognizing that the career of staff in all the language occupational groups at the United Nations represents a functional continuum within which the range of grade levels should reflect the increasingly complex and specialized nature of the assignments performed by language groups,

Bearing in mind that the problems confronting the various language groups are not of a comparable nature and that the more recently introduced official languages require particular attention,

1. Approves the proposals of the Secretary-General aimed at reclassifying language posts so that:

(a) The number of posts reclassified is in proportion to the number established for each of the six languages of the United Nations;

(b) The translators, interpreters, verbatim reporters, editors, copy-preparers and proof-readers benefit from the reclassification measures;

2. Requests the Secretary-General to apply self-revision on a provisional and experimental basis, to the extent that it does not affect the quality of United Nations documents, whatever the official or working language used;

3. Further requests the Secretary-General to report to the General Assembly at its thirty-sixth session on the implementation of the present resolution.

FINANCING OF THE APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE YEAR 1981

The General Assembly

Resolves that for the year 1981:

1. Budget appropriations in a total amount of \$US 715,254,600 consisting of \$US 623,896,600 being one half of the appropriations initially approved for the biennium 1980-1981 by General Assembly resolution 34/230 A of 20 December 1979, \$US 91,358,000 being the additional appropriations approved during the thirty-fifth session by resolution A above shall be financed in accordance with regulations 5.1 and 5.2 of the Financial Regulations of the United Nations as follows:

(a) \$16,657,300 being half of the estimated income other than staff assessment approved for the biennium 1980-1981 by resolution 34/230 B of 20 December 1979;

(b) \$11,121,000 being the estimated increase in income other than staff assessment approved by resolution B above;

(c) \$56,496 being contributions of a new Member State for 1979-1980;

(d) \$17,963,025 being the balance of the surplus account as at 31 December 1979;

(e) \$669,456,779 being the assessment on Member States in accordance with resolution 34/6 A of 25 October 1979 on the scale of assessments for the years 1980, 1981 and 1982.

2. There shall be set off against the assessment on Member States, in accordance with the provisions of General Assembly resolution 973 (X) of 15 December 1955, their respective share in the Tax Equalization Fund in the total amount of \$US 98,120,015 consisting of:

(a) \$94,014,300 being half of the estimated staff assessment income approved by resolution 34/230 B;

(b) \$5,868,900 being the estimated increase in income from staff assessment approved by resolution B above;

(c) \$1,763,185 being the decrease in actual income from staff assessment compared to the revised estimates for the biennium 1978-1979, approved by resolution 34/223 B of 20 December 1979.
