NOTE BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

1. The Chairman of the Security Council Commission of Inquiry established under resolution 496 (1981) has informed me that the Commission received, on 7 September and 5 October 1982, respectively, from the Permanent Mission of the Republic of Seychelles and that of South Africa copies of the record of the relevant court proceedings. The Commission has begun the examination of these documents in accordance with its mandate under resolution 507 (1982) but has not yet been able to complete its work, owing to the length of the South African transcript, which covers over 4,000 pages. Accordingly, the Commission has requested a further extension of the date of the submission of its supplementary report.

2. Following informal consultations on the matter, it has been found that no member of the Security Council has objection to the Commission's request, and the Chairman of the Commission has been informed that the Council agrees to an extension of two weeks until the middle of November 1982.
