Statement issued on 19 September 1982 by the President of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan condemning the massacre of the Palestinian refugees at the Sabra and Shatila Camps in West Beirut

Reports of the massacre of innocent Palestinians in Beirut have caused profound grief to the people of Pakistan and filled us with a deep sense of shock and horror.

The Government and people of Pakistan join me in condemning the pre-meditated atrocities perpetrated against defenceless men, women and children in the refugee camps of Shatila and Sabra, which constitute a crime against humanity. The barbarism of the Israeli aggressor is responsible for the continuing genocide of the Palestinian people and demands the unreserved condemnation of the entire world community.

In the face of this tragedy, Pakistan calls upon the United Nations to fulfil its foremost obligations to uphold the basic human rights and to maintain world peace and security. In this context, the five Permanent Members of the Security Council bear primary responsibility for taking immediate and effective steps to prevent any further shedding of Palestinian blood and to take every measure required to restrain Israeli forces from flouting all precepts of human conduct and international law.
