QUESTION OF THE FALKLAND ISLANDS (MALVINAS)

Note verbale dated 2 November 1982 from the Permanent Mission of Argentina to the United Nations addressed to the Secretariat

The Permanent Mission of the Argentine Republic to the United Nations has the honour to request the Secretariat of the United Nations to issue the attached text, to be added after paragraph 114, on page 21 of document A/37/553.

Page 21 of document A/37/553, remainder of paragraph 114 and addition of paragraphs 115, 116 and 117

Atlantic and to cease engaging in hostile measures against the Argentine Republic and reiterated their support for and solidarity with Argentina in all its struggles to bring an end to the colonial presence in the Malvinas Islands.

115. They deplored the loss of life in the armed conflict in the South Atlantic, and stressed that the continuation of this conflict could have adverse consequences not only within Latin America but beyond it. They called for a cessation of the present hostilities and for a just, negotiated, peaceful and permanent settlement to the Malvinas question in accordance with Security Council resolutions 502 and 505 in the entirety and on the basis of the principles and decisions of the Movement of Non-Aligned Countries and resolution 1514 (XV), 2065 (XX), 2621 (XXV), 3160 (XXVIII) and 31/49 of the General Assembly of the United Nations.

116. The Ministers expressed their support for the good office efforts of the United Nations Secretary-General to find a fair, peaceful and negotiated solution to the conflict in the South Atlantic.

117. The Ministers deplored the use of vetoes, on 4 June 1982, by two permanent members of the Security Council against a draft resolution of the Council aimed at achieving a cease-fire and implementing its own relevant resolutions in their entirety.
