ANNEX

Statement dated 13 December 1987 issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Viet Nam

On 12 December 1987, the Ministry of National Defence of the People's Republic of Kampuchea issued a statement welcoming Thailand's withdrawal of a large number of its troops for from the Kampuchean/Thai border. At the same time, the Defence Ministry of the People's Republic of Kampuchea also stated that with its consent and that of the Command of the Vietnamese volunteer army in Kampuchea, Vietnamese volunteers stationed along the Kampuchean/Thai border would withdraw 15 kilometres from that border into Kampuchean territory, excluding some areas where the opposition Khmer forces still continue to infiltrate into Kampuchea for sabotage activities against the Kampuchean people. The People's Republic of Kampuchea hopes that, following this act of goodwill, the voluntary return of Kampuchean refugees in Thailand will take place or the Kampuchean refugee camps will be removed deep into Thailand, where civilians should be separated from the armed forces, along with the cessation of the use of Thai territory by opposition Khmer forces against the Kampuchean people. The statement of the Defence Ministry of the People's Republic of Kampuchea also reiterates the proposal by the People's Republic of Kampuchea for the creation of a zone of peace along the Kampuchean/Thai border under international supervision.

The Foreign Ministry of the Socialist Republic of Viet Nam fully supports the statement of the Defence Ministry of the People's Republic of Kampuchea, considering it a positive response of the People's Republic of Kampuchea to Thailand's act of goodwill. The statement of 28 November 1987 by the Commander-in-Chief of the Thai army and the statement of 12 December 1987 by the Defence Ministry of the People's Republic of Kampuchea are important efforts aimed at alleviating the tense situation along the Kampuchean/Thai border, thus contributing to the search for a political solution to the Kampuchean problem and to peace and stability in South-East Asia in the interests of the countries of the region.

The Foreign Ministry of the Socialist Republic of Viet Nam reiterates its proposal for the signing of a treaty of non-aggression between the Socialist Republic of Viet Nam and the Kingdom of Thailand and renews its preparedness to meet the Thai Foreign Ministry to exchange views on issues of common concern.
