SUBJECT: Petition

The Chairman Fourth Committee of the United Nations General Assembly New York

Sir,

We have the honour to send you this petition in order to inform you of the state of affairs maintained by the French Government in our country.

As a result of our country's struggle for independence Roland PRE, the Colonial Governor, the tool of the reactionary French Government, unleashed a real war against our people in May of this year. To save his face with the forthcoming Visiting Mission he is setting up a series of parties, whose real aim is merely to divert the Cameroonians from their national aspirations, immediate reunification and independence of the Cameroons. The war in May was not enough for the criminals; they are still massing troops in the principal regions of the Territory in order "to intimidate the people on the day of the United Nations Mission's arrival" and, if need by, "to resort to violence". All day long rifles are being issued to certain Chiefs - conformists of course - with the aim of provoking the people on the day of the Visiting Mission's arrival. This applies to the Chief of the Batcham groupment.

The Cameroonian people considers that it would be impossible to conduct a referendum objectively under such conditions of terror. We therefore beg you to secure from the delegation of the French Government minimum guarantees for the successful conduct of the Mission's work, including:

liberation of all political prisoners;

cessation of judicial proceedings against the leaders, responsible officials and active members of democratic organizations in the Cameroons;

withdrawal of the troops who are swarming over the Territory;

payment of compensation for theft, fire and looting.

We consider that the Visiting Mission can conduct the necessary consultations objectively only if this is done.

In the hope that our petition will receive consideration we have the honour to be, etc.
