of so-celled municinal elections and the speeding up of connunity development in the larger cities - as though that vere what is needed, to achieve the independence and unification of cur country!

Having no legal argunents to explain avey the Chad reinforcements, the blocking of postal communcations and the warmants for the seizure of personal correspordence, the French colonialists - through the Council of Ministers which has no jurisdiction in the Cameroons, a Territory under United Nations Trusteeship - have taken an emptr, unfounded aecisic. to dissolve the UPC, JDC, CGT and UNETEC, by virtue of one of their decrees prohibiting armed association of organizations throvghout the rrench territory. It must be borne in mind, hovever, that the Camercons is under United Nations Internetional Trusteeship; it is not a French territory and is not concerned in these matters. The UFC is not an armed association; it is a Cameroonian movement for national liberation that is supported by the parties nentioned above. We world respectfully point out to all States Members of the United Nations that no valid solution for any Cemeroonien problem would be achieved in tho absence of these progressive associations that the French colonialists clajm to have dissolved, nor could the Visiting Mission carry out its inquiry to eny useful purpose.

In the belief that the precise aim of this manoeuvre is to frustrate the work of the Visiting Mission which is shortly to arrive in the Cameroons and the chief tasks of which are:
(A) to investieate the freely expressed desires of the people comprising the two Cameroons with respect to the INDEPENDENCE AND IMEEDATE UNIFICATION OF THE CAMEROONS; and
(B) to carry out a serious investigation into the damace caused by the recent var in the Cameroons;

VE ACCORDINGLY REOUEST:

1. that, as a preliminary, the Secretary-General intervene with the French Covernment to secure the release of persons arbitrarily imprisoned and the totai cessation of 111 egal judicial action directed against the officers, leaders and active members of progressive crganizations.
2. We disavow all the manoeuvres started by the French colonialists following upon the blocdy events in the Cameroons, i.e., the organization $0 f$ municipal elections, Africanization of Governnent personnel, Government councils, projected or othervise. Our desire is to achieve the INDEPENDEVCE and IMEDIATE UITFICATTCN OF THE CAMERCOHS and to improve our system of government.
