Sir,

We have the honour to submit to you the following.

On 22 May last, a cold war was unleashed in our country by order of Roland Pré, High Commissioner for the Colonies. Roland Pré came from metropolitan France to make war in a country under United Nations trusteeship, which is a strange occurrence, for our country never was a colony.

The colonialists are setting up village committees and committees of municipal councillors throughout the territory, including our centre, although since they have been in the Cameroons they have never told us that there is such a body as a village committee. The outbreak of the cold war has made them think of forming village committees to prevent the Cameroonian population from claiming its rights before the Visiting Mission.

N'Lohé, with barely 2,000 inhabitants, has no less than six delegates.

We want the immediate unification and independence of the country and a United Nations Government-General to come and protect the valiant Cameroonians who are left.
