To the Secretary-General, United Nations,
New York

Sir,

I have the honour most respectfully to bring to your notice the following facts:

In 1932, while I was serving with the British Army, Ndjantou, Village Chief at Bandounga, forcibly entered the concession belonging to my father Feu-Mekong, Chief of Boulang (I), killed him, seized his property and divided it into two parts, one of which he gave to the Village Chief at Bangangté. On my return in 1944, I built a hut on this land, and was promptly driven from it by the said Chief Ndjantou. I have lodged 15 complaints all of which have been blocked by the Bangangté Subdivision, Bamiléké Region. I have received no reply to my complaints since then. I have copies of all my registered letters and receipts for them. See what injustices the French commit in the Cameroons.

Having been driven away, I am now living at Bantoum (2), Ndikiniméki Subdivision, Mbam Region.
