PETITION FROM MR. LUC NTAMAK TEMB CONCERNING THE  
CAMEROONS UNDER FRENCH ADMINISTRATION

(Circulated in accordance with rule 85 of the rules  
of procedure of the Trusteeship Council)

Sir,

I am most respectfully lodging a complaint against the following UPC members:

Nkot Paul, Chairman, Ndjom Paul, Makou Tonye, Moèm Nlénd, Nyèmb, Yogo, Mayi Ndjok, Mtua Bakina, Likeng Gwed, Ndgènè Bingam, Kwei Mbog, Mbog Bayika, Um-Um and several others. They set fire to my house on 21 December 1956. They seized hold of me, tied me up and forced me to hand over 8,000 francs. My house measured nine and a half by seven metres and it contained: 3 tables, 6 armchairs, 21 chairs, 4 wooden beds, 1 chaise longue, 1 Aïda lamp, 6 hurricane lamps, 1 cupboard, 2 watches, 4 mattresses, 2 mosquito nets, 8 blankets, 4 pillows, 3 trunks full of clothing, including 20 pairs of trousers, 2 jackets, 12 shirts, 2 ties, 6 pieces of underwear, 4 hats, 5 pairs of shoes, 5 machetes, 43,000 francs and, last but not least, a room which was used as a shop contained 175,000 francs' worth of goods.

Two kitchens which were burned down contained: 4 basins, 30 soup bowls, 25 plates, 20 spoons, 7 forks, 4 iron stew pans, 7 saucepans, 12 baskets, 1 sack of ground-nuts, 2 sacks of cocoa, 2 chickens.

I ask that the perpetrators of this piece of sabotage should be tracked down, arrested and severely punished.

Hoping that my complaint will be acted upon, I have the honour to be, etc...
