To: The President of the United Nations General Assembly, New York.

Sir,

As I am rather pressed for time I shall come to the point without further ado.

When UFC members were burning down houses they destroyed the following articles belonging to me: four pairs of trousers, five shirts, one box of clothes belonging to my wife, one chest, one paraffin lamp, fourteen plates, six forks, ten spoons, four saucepans, one large saucepan, two hats, one Aida lamp, six books, one pipe, four chairs, one table, one couch, two doors, two windows, one iron bedstead, one wooden bedstead, six blankets, two bedsheets, four coupe-coupes, one hatchet, four pairs of leather shoes, two pairs of tennis shoes, one table clock and 11,000 francs.

I am at my wit's end because this is all I had. I shall end here.
