PETITION FROM TWENTY-EIGHT CAMEROONIAN PLANTERS CONCERNING THE CAMEROONS UNDER FRENCH ADMINISTRATION

(Circulated in accordance with rule 85 of the rules of procedure of the Trusteeship Council)

## PETITION

from twenty-eight Kamerunian Planters

to . the Secretary-General of the United Nations, New York (USA)

We have the honour to inform you that since May 1955 we have been living under the threats of the reactionary French Government in the Cameroons.

Everywhere the French administration and its hirelings menace us.

Their principal method is the re-kindling of war throughout the Cameroons.

Thus on 15 November 1956, the Chief Regional Officer and the Chief of the Gendarmes in the Bamiliké Region, the Chief Subdivisional Officer and the Chief of the Gendarmes of Fafang visited the chiefdom of the Village of Fodjomokwet. After their return, on 21 November 1956, the Chief of Fodjomokwet started a war against the neighbouring Chief of Fondanti, destroying the huts of the inhabitants of Fondanti Village, stealing their belongings, setting fire to houses. Man and women were struck and wounded.

It is easy to see that the French Government wants to annihilate the inhabitants of the Kameruns.

We would beg the United Nations urgently to send a delegation to the Cameroons to grant it immediate unification and independence.
