To the President of the General Assembly and the Chairman of the Fourth Committee
of the eleventh session of the United Nations,
c/o the Secretary-General of the United Nations, New York, U.S.A.

Sir,

We have been telling you since 25 May 1955 that we are in a state of suffering
that is even causing us to die. Come and see that we have just learned how, on
the night of 22 November 1956, the colonialists entered the huts of our fellow-
countrymen at Douala to menace the Kamerunians because they did not want to vote
for the French loi-cadre.

We protest against any elections that may be held in Kamerun without United
Nations supervision or total and complete amnesty.

All elections in Kamerun at present are elections by foreigners coming from
other territories of French West Africa and by the colonialists with their lackeys.

We say to you that we are tired of the French colonialists.

We have one thing to ask of the United Nations: our immediate Independence
and Unification and a United Nations High Commissioner in Kamerun.
