Sir,

I have the honour respectfully to inform you of the losses which I suffered as a result of the UPC people setting fire to houses on 19 December 1956, including eight huts and a shop with a capital of 260,000 francs.

- l oil press
- 1 12-celibre sporting gun
- 2 bicycles
- 350,000 francs in cash

2 cubic metres of lumber worth 14,000 francs were burned, as well as four cases filled with clothes. All my files were burned, including securities worth 126,000 francs and my personal legal documents. The eight huts contained living-room furniture, two large wardrobes and the usual kitchen utensils.
