PETITION FROM MR. BOGMIS PARTELEMY CONCERNING THE CAMEROONS  
UNDER FRENCH ADMINISTRATION

(Circulated in accordance with rule 85 of the rules of procedure  
of the Trusteeship Council).

Eséka, 28 February 1957

To the President of the United Nations General Assembly,  
New York (USA).

Sir,

I have the honour to write to you to lodge a complaint against the UPC leaders who have organized bands capable of destroying all the motor road and railway bridges.

I was arrested on 19 December 1956 and led off into the bush by a band of more than 100 people; there I was held for a week and it was only thanks to the police that I was released.

These saboteurs, after stealing my possessions, finally set fire to my four houses. Here is a list of the property I lost:

- 4 goats
- 20 chairs and 4 tables
- 4 chests of clothes
- 4 sacks of cocoa
- 36 dishes
- 2 basins
- 20 spoons
- 20 forks
- 2 buckets

2 iron pots

13,000 francs in cash.

I would, therefore, request you, Sir, to punish the leaders of the UPC.
