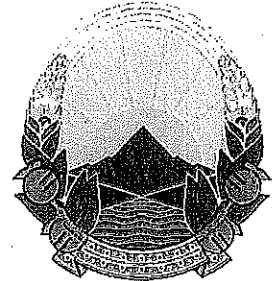

Done in New York, on 15th of March, 2019.



PROTOCOL
ON THE ESTABLISHMENT OF DIPLOMATIC AND CONSULAR RELATIONS
BETWEEN
GEORGIA AND THE REPUBLIC OF NORTH MACEDONIA

Georgia and the Republic of North Macedonia, later referred to as "Parties".

Guided by mutual willingness to develop relations of friendship and cooperation between the two countries in political, economic, cultural and other fields, have decided to establish diplomatic relations at the Ambassadorial level and to establish consular relations.

Parties are convinced that the establishment of diplomatic and consular relations between Georgia and the Republic of North Macedonia corresponds to the interests of the two states, is not directed against any other country and will facilitate the strengthening of international cooperation and universal peace.

Parties, guided by the principles enshrined in the Charter of the United Nations and the other fundamental norms and principles of international law, have agreed to develop the relations between the two States on the basis of the principles of sovereign equality, co-operation and friendly relations among states, territorial integrity and inviolability of frontiers of sovereign states, non-interference in internal affairs of another state.

Parties have agreed to base their diplomatic relations on the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations, signed on April 18th, 1961 and to base their consular relations on the Vienna Convention on Consular Relations, signed on April 24th, 1963.

This Protocol is in force upon the signature.

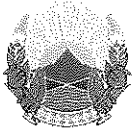
