**PROTOCOL**  
**ON**  
**THE ESTABLISHMENT OF DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS**  
**BETWEEN**  
**THE REPUBLIC OF SERBIA**  
**AND**  
**TUVALU**

The Republic of Serbia and Tuvalu,

Desiring to develop relations of friendship and cooperation between two countries in political, economic, cultural and other fields,

Based on the principles of equality, sovereignty, territorial integrity and non-interference in internal affairs,

Guided by the aims enshrined in the Charter of the United Nations and fundamental norms of international law,

Have agreed to establish diplomatic and consular relations between two countries and to exchange non-resident diplomatic representatives at an Ambassador's level, in accordance with the provisions of the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations signed on 18 April 1961 and the Vienna Convention on Consular Relations signed on 24 April 1963,

In Witness Whereof, the undersigned, being fully authorized by their respective governments, have signed this protocol.

Done in \_\_\_\_\_ on \_\_\_\_\_ 2019, in two authentic copies, each in Serbian and English languages, all texts being equally authentic. In case of divergence in interpretation of the Protocol, English text will prevail.
