NEW PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF TOGO PRESENTS CREDENTIALS

Biyemi Kekeh, the new Permanent Representative of Togo, presented her credentials to Secretary-General Kurt Waldheim today.

Before assuming her present office, Madame Kekeh had been the Minister of Social and Women's Affairs between 1978 and 1980, an area in which she had served as State Secretary for Public Health in 1977.

In her judicial functions, she had served as the Vice-President of the High Court of Lome in 1973, and as President from 1974 to 1977. In Abidjan (Ivory Coast), she had served as an advisor to the High Court from 1967 to 1972, and as a judge on juvenile matters between 1963 and 1967. Previously, she had served as a Magistrate at the Tribunal of Modern Law in Lome.

Her educational background includes degrees in Private Law, Criminology and Magistracy from the Ecole Nationale de la France d'Outre-Mer, Paris (1958-1960), and a Licence en Droit from the University of Lyons.

Born in Lome in March 1931, Madame Kekeh is married and has four children.
