NEW PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF EQUATORIAL GUINEA PRESENTS CREDENTIALS

The new Permanent Representative of Equatorial Guinea to the United Nations, Carmelo Nvono Nca, presented his credentials to Secretary-General Kurt Waldheim today.

Mr. Nca has most recently served as Director of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs General Office for Europe and America, a post he held from 1979 to 23 January 1980. In 1979, he was also appointed as the Government Delegate of the Ministry of National Security for the District of Ela Nguema, Bioko Province.

From 1977 to 1979, Mr. Nca was Ambassador to China in Peking. He concurrently served as Ambassador to the Democratic People's Republic of Korea and to the Socialist Republic of Viet Nam. He was Ambassador of Equatorial Guinea in Libreville, Gabon from 1975 to 1977.

Mr. Nca was Charge d'affaires of the Embassy of Equatorial Guinea in Madrid, Spain from 1973 to 1974. He served at the same Embassy as Second Secretary from 1971. In 1969 he participated in the first training course for diplomats in Equatorial Guinea.

Born on I January 1938 in Ebebiyin, Rio Muni Province, Mr. Nca undertook studies in the Lutero King School of Higher Education in Malabo and received the National Graduate Teacher's Diploma. He entered the State Civil Service as a National Graduate Teacher in 1960 and taught in various schools in Equatorial Guinea until 1969. He also participated in the Food and Nutrition Course held in the city of Bata and received the corresponding certificate of proficiency.

Mr. Nca is married and has seven children.
