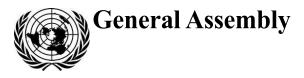

Canada

1. In a note verbale dated 1 March 2019, the Permanent Mission of Canada to the United Nations informed the Secretariat of the following:

Between 2009 and 2017, 14 students, faculty and researchers from Non-SelfGoverning Territories received scholarships from six different Global Affairs Canada scholarship programmes (see tables 1 and 2). Inhabitants from Non-Self-Governing Territories are eligible to apply for the Vanier Canada Graduate Scholarships and the Banting Postdoctoral Fellowships, Canada's most prestigious awards for doctoral students and postdoctoral fellows, respectively, working in the health sciences, natural sciences and engineering, and social sciences and humanities. Russian Federation

3. In a note verbale dated 9 April 2019, the Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations informed the Secretariat that, as at 1 October 2018, there were five students from Anguilla, one student from the United States Virgin Islands and one student from American Samoa – all studying on a commercial basis – in Russian education institutions. In addition, the acceptance plan for the 2019/20 academic year provides a quota for three students from Western Sahara.

4. In a note verbale dated 2 April 2019, the Permanent Mission of Saudi Arabia to the United Nations informed the Secretariat of the following:

In an email dated 8 April 2019, the Permanent Mission of Singapore to the United Nations informed the Secretariat of the following training programmes in various areas, including public administration and governance, information and communications technology, economic development and trade, civil aviation, and environment and urban development:

Sri Lanka

6. In a note verbale dated 8 March 2019, the Permanent Mission of Sri Lanka to the United Nations informed the Secretariat of the following:

The Ministry of City Planning, Water Supply and Higher Education of Sri Lanka conducts two scholarship programmes for foreign students to follow undergraduate and postgraduate programmes, namely:

- (a) The Sri Lanka Presidential Scholarships for Foreign Students Programme;
- (b) The Sri Lanka Commonwealth Scholarship Programme.

Foreign candidates who apply for the Government of Sri Lanka Presidential Scholarships should apply through the respective Sri Lankan missions. The scholarships are open to the 58 countries listed below:

Asian countries: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Cambodia, China, India, Indonesia, Japan, Malaysia, Maldives, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Philippines, Republic of Korea, Singapore, Thailand and Viet Nam. Non-Asian countries: Argentina, Australia, Brunei Darussalam, Brazil, Belgium, Burkina Faso, Canada, Cuba, Egypt, Estonia, Ethiopia, France, Germany, Iceland, Netherlands, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Iraq, Israel, Italy, Kenya, Kuwait, Latvia, Lithuania, New Zealand, Nigeria, Norway, Oman, Portugal, Russian Federation, Seychelles, South Africa, State of Palestine, Swaziland, Sweden, Trinidad and Tobago, Turkey, Uganda, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United Republic of Tanzania and United States of America.

The administering Powers, i.e., France, New Zealand, United Kingdom and United States, are also included in the above list. However, the Ministry has not received applications from those four countries or from any of the Non-Self-Governing Territories thus far.

In addition to sending out letters calling for applications and providing information on available courses, application forms and other details to foreign missions, the Ministry also publishes online notices on its website (see www.mohe.gov.lk).

The total number of undergraduate scholarships offered under the Government of Sri Lanka Presidential Scholarship Programme is 50 per year. Half of those are allocated to non-Asian countries. In addition, two postgraduate scholarships are offered to Commonwealth countries under the Sri Lanka Commonwealth Scholarship Programme administered by the Commonwealth Scholarship Commission in the United Kingdom.
