Sir,

I, the undersigned Omar Hassan Iusuf ex Policeman No. 3922, have the honour to state that on 15th May 1950 I had gone to Brava Head Office of the S.Y.L., on the following day I was called by the Officer Commanding the Police Force of Brava and asked if I had gone to the Head Office of the S.Y.L., I had replied as it was true I had gone to the Head Office. The officer then told me to wait that he was sending report to Merca. On 23rd June last I was sent from Brava to Merca and as soon as I arrived at Merca I reported to the Captain of Police and this forthwith told me to take off the uniform and told me that I was discharged from the service because I was belonging to the S.Y.L. I am fit and proficient of the service and have not committed any fault whatever to deserve discharge from the service. I think that belonging to the S.Y.L. is not a lawful reason to discharge me from the service.

Now therefore I have the honour to apply for your kind assistance to examine my case.
