

PETITION FROM CHIEF MAHAMUD OCAR AND OTHERS CONCERNING SOMALIAND UNDER ITALIAN ADMINISTRATION

Note by the Secretary-General: In accordance with rule 85 and supplementary rules F and L of the rules of procedure for the Trusteeship Council, the Secretary-General has the honour to transmit to the members of the Trusteeship Council, to the Government of Italy as the Administering Authority of the Trust Territory of Somaliland, and to the Governments of Colombia, Egypt, and the Philippines as members of the Advisory Council for the Trust Territory of Somaliland, a communication dated 22 September 1952, from Chief Mahamud Ocar and others, concerning the Trust Territory of Somaliland under Italian administration.

To the Advisory Council of the United Nations, Mogadiscio

We, the undersigned, Chiefs and Notables of the following villages: Sciambichei, Borini Mohamed Hussen, Rahole and Borini Saad (Margherita) beg to submit the following respectful petition:

On behalf of our people we request that all activities of the Somali Youth League be stopped in our territory of the Lower Juba Province. The said League is the sole responsible for murders, abuses, violences, etc.

We wish to co-operate with the Italian Trusteeship Administration and we do not want to be molested by anybody.

We ask for the permanent closing down of the Somali Youth League in our territory of the Lower Juba Province. We trust that this petition will be favourably considered and we thank you in advance.
