PETITION FROM MR. GUIED GARAD ABDI AND OTHERS CONCERNING SOMALILAND UNDER ITALIAN ADMINISTRATION

The undersigned Somalis, belonging to Garre Tribe, in the territory of Recaile-Garre (Barire) take the liberty to set out the following:

During Italian occupation of Somalia, all members of the tribe were sent as labourers in the Genale farms, and were forced to abandon their shambas situated in Recaile. These shambas were arbitrarily occupied since then by Abagibil tribesmen of Barire, and more exactly by the Headman, Maio Omar. The danger of colonization having disappeared, the undersigned went back to Racaile, but were unable to get back the land they formerly owned, for it was occupied by Abagibil.

Up to date, many applications have been made, both to British, during their occupation, and to the Italian Administration, but without results. At the latest petition sent to the District Commissioner, Afgoi, they were summoned by the District Commissioner who told them to apply to the Khadi, Audegle, to settle the matter according to sharaitic law.

The Khadi refused until now to come to an agreement, and even to listen to their complaints and to hear their Uakil (lawyer).

Since it is clear that the signatories of this petition can obtain justice only through the good offices of either the Trusteeship Council, or the Territorial Council or the Trusteeship Administration, they invite the above-mentioned organs to take action and see that the question, which threatens to become critical, with possible unforeseeable consequences, be settled.
