PETITION FROM REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ODAUEN TRIBE CONCERNING SOMALTIAND UNDER ITALIAN AUMINISTRATION

MOGADISCIO

We read in the <u>Corriere della Somalia</u> of 1 December 1955 that with the publication of an announcement in the Official Gazette (<u>Bollettino Ufficiale</u>), issue No. 12 of the same date, fixing 29 February 1956 as the date for the elections to the Territorial Council, the first phase of the elections carried out by means of the Shirs must be considered closed.

We have so far not received satisfaction concerning the communication sent to you on 27 November 1955 and we must therefore conclude that the election result contested by us for the reasons set forth in the statements submitted to the Regional Judge and confirmed in the above-quoted communication has been declared valid by the Administering Authority.

In our own name and in that of the whole of the Degle <u>rer</u>, which has expressly instructed us to act for it, we hereby renew our formal, though vain, protest and we wish to state once again that neither now nor in the future shall we ever recognize the three brothers, MAHAD ALIO OSMAN, SHEIKH ALIO OSMAN

and JUSUF ALIO OSMAN, as our legitimate representatives, nor shall we recognize as a legitimate representative of the Degle <u>rer</u> the person, whoever he may be, whom these gentlemen will appoint to the Territorial Council.

Moreover, we feel it our duty to inform you that we have not succeeded in obtaining a free and democratic election and that the provisions of article 2 of Ordinance No. 5 of 30 March 1955 have not been applied. We renew our urgent request that we may have a councillor of our own in the District Council, a man chosen freely by us, even without a salary if you think that necessary.

We await your decision.

MOGADISCIO

We, the undersigned, representatives of the Odauen tribe of Afgoi,
Urgently request you to take action in a matter of vital importance
to us. We lay our problems before you and ask you to give them favourable
attention.

On the basis of the list of tribes published by the Afgoi District Commissioner, the <u>SHIR</u> of the ODAUEN tribe assembled on 18 August 1955 to elect the new Chief, who was to represent it in the District Council set up under Ordinance No. 5 of 30 March 1955.

The ODAUEN tribe consists of five <u>rers</u>, together with one <u>rer</u> of the DEGLE tribe of Audegle (living with it), i.e. a total of six <u>rers</u> comprising at most 450 to 500 electors, as may be confirmed at the Regsitrar's Office at Afgoi, since none of the tribe are nomads.

Under article 2 of Ordinance No. 5 of 30 March 1955, District Councillors are elected by these tribal units or other groups of the population organized on a territorial basis and residing either permanently or for the greater part of the year in the <u>circoscrizione</u> of the district presided over by a responsible Chief on the date on which the ordinance comes into force.

In violation of the provisions of the said article, other tribes which had already elected their District Councillor took part in the voting, i.e. the SAPTI OMAR tribe, one of whose members was the Chairman of the Supervisory Committee of the Odauen SHIR, the GOBIAN tribe, the UADAN tribe, the GALAUAR tribe, about a dozen young Arabs from Afgoi, some seventy members of the Beghedi tribe of Mogadiscio, accompanied by their Notable, SHEIKH MOHAMED OSMAN, the Degle tribe, some forty members of the Bandabo tribe of Mogadiscio and about ninety students of the School of Islamic Studies of Mogadiscio, accompanied by a certain SHEIKH OSMAN ABUCAR, rer sheikh of Mogadiscio.

In the face of such a flagrant violation of the Ordinance, GASSIM ALI, the present Chief of the ODAUEN tribe, asked the Chairman of the Supervisory Committee, in the presence of numerous witnesses, to see that the participants' right to vote was verified and that all those who were not eligible to vote, because they did not belong to the six <u>rers</u> constituting the ODAUEN tribe or the DEGIE <u>rer</u> (living with it) which forms part of the DEGIE tribe of Audegle, should be excluded. The Chairman, however, refused to comply with the request, saying that he had supreme authority in the matter of the SHIR.

Acting in agreement with MAHAD ALIO OSMAN, the candidate of the DEGLE tribe (not the ODAUEN tribe), he proceeded to count the votes in favour of the candidate MAHAD ALIO and found that there were more than 700. To these 700 votes cast for MAHAD ALIO should be added those cast for GASSIM ALI, the present Chief of the tribe, who renounced the count in protest against the irregularities which had been committed; the total number of electors taking part in the vote would therefore have amounted to more than a thousand yet, as has already been pointed out, the voters of the tribe number 500 at the most.

In order to have their own representative in the District Council under the name of the ODAUEN tribe, which is composed of five <u>rers</u>, the <u>rer</u> of the DEGLE tribe, living with the ODAUEN tribe, invited people from outside, who, having been paid to do so, voted as if they were electors of the ODAUEN tribe.

That the <u>SHIR</u> was irregular emerges even more clearly from the fact that all the votes were cast for three brothers of the DEGLE <u>rer</u> (living with the Odauen tribe) and none for the candidates of the five <u>rers</u> of the ODAUEN tribe, for which the SHIR was convened.

- 1. MAHAD ALIO OSMAN was elected councillor in the District Council;
- 2. His brother SHEIKH ALIO OSMAN was chosen as representative of the voters not in possession of an identity card;
- 3. The third brother <u>JUSUF ALIO OSMAN</u> was chosen to deputize for his brother <u>SHEIKH ALIO OSMAN</u> in case of absence.

We would point out that the Chairman of the Supervisory Committee of the Odauen SHIR has a criminal record. He was sentenced to penal servitude by the former Government of Italian Somaliland and it was only when the British troops entered Mogadiscio that he escaped from the Central Prison, without having served his sentence. He does not therefore appear to be a man who can inspire the public with confidence.

It should also be recalled that GASSIM ALI, the present Chief of the tribe, following a threat by the District Commissioner that he would in no case be re-elected to office, had applied to the Regional Commissioner for permission to attend the SHIR, but contrary to the promise he was given, when the day came he was informed, through a certain GEILANI, that for certain reasons it was not possible for him to intervene.

In conclusion, the ODAUEN tribe requests that, pursuant to article 12 of the Ordinance, the <u>SHIR</u> may be declared invalid, on the grounds that the provisions of the Ordinance were infringed, and that a new <u>SHIR</u> may be held to which shall be admitted only members of the following six <u>RERS</u>: the five <u>rers</u> constituting the ODAUEN tribe and one <u>rer</u> of the DEGLE tribe living with it.

We would again emphasize that the six <u>RERS</u> do not number more than 450 to 500 electors at the most and we want the <u>SHIR</u> to be held in accordance with article 2 of Ordinance No. 5 of 30 March 1955.

Confident that you will give this matter your courteous attention, and in the name of all the five <u>rers</u> of the ODAUEN tribe, we have the honour to be, etc.
