PETITION FROM MR. ALI NUR ABDI CONCERNING SOMALILAND
UNDER ITALIAN ADMINISTRATION

(Circulated in accordance with rule 85 of the rules
of procedure of the Trusteeship Council)

Mission of Delegates of the United Nations

MOGADISCIO

The undersigned, ALI NUR ABDI - Omar Mohamud Rer Abdulle Farah Tribe, 66 years old, resident of the Bondere Village, Mogadiscio; has the honour to request of this Hon. Mission to provide for his case. In fact he declares to have been unjustly treated by the Italian Trusteeship Administration of Somalia.

The undersigned was the proprietor of three Macaie (native shops) one in Galcaio, one in Uadere, and one in Mogadiscio. A.F.I.S. refused to liquidate him for the damages he suffered, therefore refusing him the justice that was confirmed to him in 1957, that he would be liquidated with his rights.^{1/}

The undersigned also declares that his claim against Captain Gilli, liquidator of rights for Somali ex-military, who refused to liquidate the rights of the undersigned after he had served under him for thirty-five years. Also he was being paid So.60 a month and he declares that for four months he was not paid, making the sum So.240. The undersigned presented six persons who testified for him.

He asks of you that he may affront the Military Court and ask to be liquidated his legal rights and wages. He closes this letter saying that this mission is his attorney, and he wants to have his rights.
