CARLOS ALFREDO BERNARDES

Carlos Alfredo Bernardes, who today was appointed as Special Representative of the Secretary-General in Cyprus, was Permanent Representative of Brazil to the United Nations from July 1963 to August 1964, when he returned to his country.

Mr. Bernardes was Secretary-General of the Brazilian Ministry of External Relations, 1962-1963, and in 1958 served as President of the Board of Governors of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA).

Carlos Alfredo Bernardes was born in Rio de Janeiro on 21 April 1916, and after receiving the LL.B. degree from the Law School of the University of Rio de Janeiro, he entered the Brazilian Foreign Service in 1939.

He served in the Brazilian Embassies in Lisbon (1944-46), Paris (1948-51) and Washington (1959-61). From 1952 to 1959, he served in the Brazilian Mission to the United Nations.

He was a member of the Brazilian delegations to the Third Consultative Meeting of the Ministers of Foreign Relations of the American Republics held in Rio de Janeiro in 1942; the Paris Peace Conference in 1956; the Inter-American Conference for the Maintenance of Peace and Security on the Continent held in Rio de Janeiro in 1947; the Ninth Inter-American Conference in Bogota in 1948; the First Meeting of the Inter-American Commission on Nuclear Energy held in Washington in 1959; and the Eighth Consultative Meeting of the Ministers of Foreign Relations of the American Republics held in Punta del Este, Uruguay, in 1962.
