COMMUNICATION FROM THE ASSOCIATION OF TOGOLESE STUDENTS IN FRANCE CONCERNING TOGOLAND UNDER FRENCH ADMINISTRATION

FIFTH EXTRAORDINARY CONGRESS OF TOGOLESE STUDENTS

held in Paris, on 14 April 1957, at 6 bis, Cité Rougemont, Paris (9)

I. MOTION CONCERNING GENERAL POLICY

The FIFTH EXTRAORDINARY CONGRESS of Togolese Students, held in Paris on 14 April 1957, has considered what line of action to follow with regard to the new situation created by the Statute of 24 August 1956.

FAITHFUL to the undeviating position of the Association of Students, the Congress is still of the opinion that the Statute of 24 August does not in any way meet the real aspirations of the Togolese people for independence. The Very conditions under which this Statute has been drawn up and applied and the unrepresentative character of the present members of the Government and the Legislative Assembly are so many proofs of the consolidation of French dominion over Togoland.

MORE THAN EVER, the mass of the people and all anti-colonialist forces in Togoland must unite and redouble their vigilance so as to ensure the maintenance of international Trusteeship until national independence is achieved.

SOLEMNLY CALLS FOR the formation of an expanded anti-colonialist front based on a minimum programme comprising:

- (1) The dissolution of the Legislative Assembly.
- (2) A general election under the supervision of the United Nations.
- (3) The formation of a national coalition government to achieve the independence of Togoland.
