PETITION PRAYING FOR A U.N. HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR TOGOLAND UNDER BOTH U.K.T.
AND FRENCH ADMINISTRATION.

An Inaugural ceremony of the opening of the local branch of the Togoland Congress Office took place at Teteman Buem State on the 27th September, 1953. The Office is therefore opened and ready for all communications to and from United Nations.

There were 20,000 people including the Government Agent and all the Natural and Tradditional Rulers of Southern Section of Togoland who jointly and severally resolved as follows:

That the petitioners herewith request that immediate steps be taken to grant them the U.N. High Commissioner who could achieve peace and prosperity for the Joint Council and independence of Togoland under the two Ad. Authorities.
