As at 19 October 2019, a total of 907 educational institutions, 206 medical centres and 32,520 houses have been rebuilt and 1,096.5 km of roads have been repaired.

Militants of illegal armed groups fired on Imarah and Binyamin in Aleppo Governorate; on Karmil, Murtlu and Quljiq in Ladhiqiyah Governorate; on Habit, Kafr Ayn, Salihiyah, Ziyarah, Khirbat Abidin, Sukkariyah and Kafrayya in Idlib Governorate; and on Tall Mutawazi and Kharab al-Khitazu in Hama Governorate.

A comparative analysis of the intensity of shelling of Syrian populated areas from the Idlib de-escalation area reveals no sign of any decrease in the rate of ceasefire violations, which in turn indicates that the illegal armed groups remain determined to engage in hostilities.

Crack military personnel trained at the military police centre in Vladikavkaz and experienced in the conduct of such operations have arrived in the Syrian Arab Republic.

The deployment of units of the Syrian army along the line of contact with the Turkish armed forces is ongoing. The Centre for Reconciliation of Opposing Sides is monitoring the situation in those areas. Currently, the overall situation is stable.

Reports by some foreign media of a worsening in the situation and clashes between Syrian government forces and pro-Turkish groups around Tall Tamr, in Hasakah Governorate, are inaccurate.

North of Murak, in Hama Governorate, units of the Syrian government forces destroyed a sabotage group of militants attempting to mine a road used to deliver food and humanitarian supplies.

Near Kabanah, in Ladhiqiyah Governorate, militants of the Levant Liberation Organization terrorist group attempted, without success, to take control of high ground held by government troops. The attacks were repulsed.

Syrian government forces have set up 84 checkpoints along the Syrian-Turkish border, 60 around Qamishli and 24 around Kobane.

Since 23 October 2019, Russian military police have been patrolling a 10-km safe zone along the Jarabulus–Kuran, Qamishli–Faqirah and Qamishli–Saymalkah routes.

The Turkish authorities are provided with daily reports on all actions taken to implement the memorandum.

Efforts continue in the Syrian Arab Republic to resolve the conflict by non-military means and provide comprehensive assistance to the Syrian people in restoring peace.

The Centre for Reconciliation of Opposing Sides has not carried out any humanitarian operations in the past 24 hours.

Since 30 September 2015, a total of 693,127 people have returned to the Syrian Arab Republic from other countries and 1,304,916 internally displaced persons have returned to their pre-war abodes.

Assistance continues to be provided to rebuild infrastructure and create conditions conducive to the return of refugees.

As at 11 November 2019, a total of 916 educational institutions, 213 medical centres and 32,639 houses have been rebuilt and 1,103.2 km of roads have been repaired.

The Russian Federation is continuing its efforts to implement the provisions of the Russian-Turkish memorandum of understanding, which was signed on 22 October 2019.

On 12 November, a joint Russian-Turkish patrol was carried out along the Alishar–Wadi Qaba route in Aleppo Governorate. Russian military police units are also continuing their patrols along the Ayn Isa–Qabish Sharqi route in Hasakah Governorate and the Ajami–Awshariyah and Ajami–Manbij routes in Aleppo Governorate.

In spite of the ceasefire in place in the Idlib de-escalation area, militants of illegal armed groups continue to shell civilian targets.

At around 10 p.m. on 11 November, militants of the Levant Liberation Organization terrorist group shelled the Sayf al-Dawlah district of the city of Aleppo using a homemade multiple rocket launcher system. The roof of an apartment block was damaged and a room was destroyed by a rocket, and a 6-year-old girl was killed.

In the past 24 hours alone, there have been a total of 21 incidents of gunfire. Militants of illegal armed groups fired on Sabiqiyah, Aleppo, Sukkariyah and Binyamin in Aleppo Governorate; on Sanjaq, Kinnsibba, Kakhbaniyah, Safsafah, Jayqurjiq and Saraf in Ladhiqiyah Governorate; on Muqah, Niha, Haruqah, Huwayz, Qarah Jurn, Dar Hardata in Hama Governorate; and on Khan Shaykhun in Idlib Governorate.

Over the past 24 hours, the Centre for Reconciliation of Opposing Sides has carried out one humanitarian operation: in Sayda, Dar'a Governorate, 500 food parcels weighing a total of 2.45 tons were distributed to persons in need.

Militants of illegal armed groups fired on Sabiqiyah, Aleppo, Kafr Hamra, Binyamin, Mansurah, Makanis al-Duwayri and Khalasah in Aleppo Governorate; on Qal'at Marza, Karmil, Qara Jaghiz, Janajiq, Jayqurjiq, Qalaz Tahtani and Mahruqah in Ladhiqiyah Governorate; on Araym, Qarah Jurn, Qarqad, Jayyid, Huwayz and Dar Hardata in Hama Governorate; and on Tall As, Mugharat Mirza, Sukkariyah, Khan Shaykhun, Umm Sahrij, Abu Sharji and Umm al-Rajim in Idlib Governorate.

Militants of illegal armed groups fired on Binyamin, Aleppo, Sabiqiyah and Makanis al-Duwayri in Aleppo Governorate; on Jayqurjiq, Jubb al-Maghara, Mamuhiyah and Safsafah in Ladhiqiyah Governorate; on Huwayz in Hama Governorate; and on Salihiyah, Khan Shaykhun, Tamani'ah, Umm al-Rajim, Habit, Zaytunah, Wasitah, Tall Kalbah, Muqah and Tall al-Turki in Idlib Governorate.
