## JOINT COMMUNIQUÉ on the establishment of diplomatic relations between Romania and Tuvalu

## Romania and Tuvalu,

Desirous of strengthening the relations of friendship and cooperation between the two countries,

On the basis of the principles and purposes of the Charter of the United Nations and international law, particularly on international peace and security, equality among States, respect for national sovereignty, independence, international treaties, territorial integrity and non-interference in the internal affairs of States,

Have decided to establish diplomatic relations, in accordance with the provisions of the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations of April 18, 1961, as of the date of the signing of this Joint Communiqué.

In witness thereof, the undersigned Representatives, duly authorized by their respective Governments, have signed this Joint Communiqué in duplicate in the English language.
