THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ORDINANCE, 1926 (No. 10 of 1926)

The Dangerous Drugs Order in Council, 1948

WHEREAS it appears to the Governor in Council that the drugs specified in the Schedule hereto are productive, if improperly used or are capable of being converted into a substance which is or is likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by morphine or cocaine.

- NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in Ordinance the Governor in Council by subsection (2) of section 13 of the Danger- No. 10 of ous Drugs Ordinance, 1926, the following Order is hereby made: 1926, section 13 (2).
- 1. This Order may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs Order Short title. in Council, 1948.
- 2. Part V of the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, 1926, shall apply to Application the drugs specified in the Schedule hereto in the same manner as it of Part V of applies to the drugs mentioned in subsection (1) of section 13 of the Ordinance said Ordinance.

SCHEDULE

Amidone (d1-2-dimethylamino-4; 4-diphenylheptane-5-one), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of amidone. Methyldihydromorphinone (commonly known as Metopon), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of methyldihydromorphinone.
