## SECRETARY-GENERAL APPOINTS MEREDITH A. MCINTYRE

AS DEPUTY SECRETARY-GENERAL OF UNCTAD

(The following is also being issued in Geneva.)

Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar today announced his decision to appoint Meredith Alister McIntyre as Deputy Secretary-General of the United nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD), at the Assistant Secretary-General level, effective 1 August. Mr. McIntyre will replace Bernard T. Chidzero.

Mr. McIntyre, who has degrees in international economics from the London School of Economics and Political Science, London, and Nuffield College, Oxford, had served as Director in UNCTAD from 1977 to 1980, following which he has been acting as Deputy Secretary-General until the present time.

From 1974 to 1977, M. McIntyre served as Secretary-General of the Caribbean Community Secretariat, Georgetown, Guyana, and from 1967 to 1974 as Director of the Institute of Social and Economic Research, University of the West Indies, Jamaica.

From 1975 to 1976, he was Acting Project Director, ESA/OTC, and in 1967 served briefly as Economics Affairs Officer with the Economic Commission for Latin America (ECLA) in Mexico. From 1963-1967, Mr. McIntyre served as Chairman at the Division of Social Science of the University of the West Indies, Trinidad, prior to which he was Lecturer at the University of the West Indies.

Mr. McIntyre was born on 29 March 1932 in Grenada. He is married and has three children.
