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## Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples

### Organization of work

#### Note by the Chair

#### I. Subsidiary bodies

1. During its previous sessions, the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples conducted its work by considering the items before it directly at its plenary meetings. In recent years, the Special Committee has succeeded in keeping the number of its formal meetings to a minimum through increasing reliance on informal consultations, including by the Bureau, for the consideration of some of the issues before it.

2. The Chair recommends that the Special Committee continue to use informal meetings as much as possible. As warranted, the Chair would consult with the Bureau on urgent and/or specific issues relevant to the work of the Committee.

#### II. Allocation of items and procedure for consideration

3. Annexed to the present note is a list of pending matters for consideration by the Special Committee in 2018. It includes decisions adopted by the Special Committee, together with an indication of the procedure that the Committee may wish to adopt for each item. In this regard, the Chair would like to draw the particular attention of the Committee to paragraph 8 (d) of General Assembly resolution [72/111](#), in which the Special Committee was requested to develop and finalize, as soon as possible and in cooperation with the administering Power and the Territory in question, a constructive programme of work on a case-by-case basis for the Non-Self-Governing Territories, to facilitate the implementation of the mandate of the Committee and the relevant resolutions on decolonization, including resolutions on specific Territories.

4. The Special Committee should take into account the resolutions and decisions adopted by the General Assembly at its seventy-second session that are relevant to the work of the Committee, as listed in the note by the Secretary-General on the subject ([A/AC.109/2018/L.1](#)). It is also understood that the Committee should be



guided by General Assembly resolution 65/119, in which Member States were called upon to intensify their efforts to continue to implement the plan of action for the Second International Decade for the Eradication of Colonialism (A/56/61, annex) and to cooperate with the Committee in updating it as necessary, with a view to using it as the basis for a plan of action for the Third International Decade for the Eradication of Colonialism.

### **III. Order of priority for consideration of items**

5. The Chair will hold consultations with regard to the order of priority to be given to the consideration of items in plenary meetings and on specific activities envisaged under the plan of action for the Third International Decade.

6. The Special Committee will take up, as appropriate, items with regard to the list of Territories to which the Declaration is applicable.

7. In the meantime, it is suggested that the Special Committee conduct its substantive work in accordance with the schedule of meetings contained in the annex to the present note.

### **IV. Recommendations of the Special Committee to the General Assembly**

8. In accordance with established practice, it is suggested that the Special Committee continue to formulate its decisions in the same format as those of the General Assembly and to submit them to the Assembly at its seventy-third session. The Special Committee may also wish to recommend that its Rapporteur continue to follow the established format of its annual report and, once completed, submit it directly to the Assembly.

### **V. Utilization of conference-servicing resources**

9. At its seventy-second session, the General Assembly decided to waive rules 67 and 108 of its rules of procedure in order to permit meetings to be declared open and debates to proceed without the presence of the quorum required under those rules. The Assembly also decided that morning meetings should begin at 10 a.m.

10. As those measures have further enhanced the effective utilization of conference-servicing resources, it is suggested that the Special Committee continue to follow the same procedure. It should be understood that, in accordance with the rules cited, the presence of a majority of the members would continue to be required for any decisions to be taken.
