

DANGEROUS DRUGS

THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ORDER, 1948, MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL ON THE 14TH DAY OF JULY, 1948, UNDER SECTION 14 (2) OF THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1937 (L.I., NO. 23 OF 1937).

[Gazetted 18th October, 1948]

1. Short Title. This Order may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs Order, 1948.

2. Addition to list of Dangerous Drugs. Part V of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1937 (L.I. No. 23 of 1937) (which relates to the control of certain drugs productive or likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill-effects analogous to those produced by morphine or cocaine) shall apply to the following:

- (1) Amidone (dl-2-dimethylamino-4: 4-diphenyhep-tane-5-one), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of amidone.
- (2) Methyldihydromorphinone (commonly known as Metopon), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of methyldihydromorphinone.
